PERTINENT INFORMATION

2. WHEEL is forwarding the enclosed packet for COMPASS' earliest perusal. CHISEL has been requested to pass on the materials for COMPASS to study in the manner in which he deems most secure and practical.

4. Re CHALK. WHEEL is enclosing the necessary briefing guides including original site diagrams, paint specimens, and map of locale. COMPASS should, of course, expedite the casing as much as possible, but not at the expense of his security or the quality of the casing. It is proposed that COMPASS first stroll past the drop site for external observations, and later, at an interval of several days, enter the site area and place a telephone call to a pre-arranged contact (preferably CHISEL) or absenteeed SQUARE acquaintance--whose absence has previously been ascertained. After a thorough casing examination of the proposed dead drop site, COMPASS should case the proposed signal site. This casing can be done simultaneously with the casing of the dead drop site. It is believed that it is unnecessary to physically enter the signal site proper. A passing, external inspection should be sufficient. With regard to the American House drop site, WHEEL tentatively proposes to have CHALK proceed down the right-hand side of Turchanin Ulitsa (toward the Moscow River) at a specified date and time (2300 hours on four consecutive Saturdays until drop is effected). COMPASS will be on the other side of the wall to effect the recovery. The afore-mentioned plan is contingent upon COMPASS' casing of the area and recommendations for implementation of the plan. If pictures can be taken of Turchanin Ulitsa and from inside the American House courtyard of the wall and area, it would be appreciated. However, COMPASS should determine the practicality of this in terms of security.
