NND 927654 DOC #3 (M PART) SIX YEARS OF FORMAL EDUCATION. SINCE MAY 1978 BAO WAS A COMMITTEE MEMBER OF THE VIET CONG (VC) DUC TRONG DISTRICT HEADQUARTERS MILITARY STAFF UNTIL HE RALLIED IN APRIL 1971. HE JOINED THE VC IN JULY 1964 AND AFTER THREE MONTHS TRAINING WAS ASSIGNED TO THE D500 BATTALION OF VC MILITARY REGION 6 WHICH OPERATED IN LAM DONG, TÜYEN DUC, AND BINH THUAN PROVINCES. HE WAS THANSFERRED FROM TUYEN DUC TO THE VC 510TH LOCAL FORCE BATTALION IN MID-1967 AND IN MAY 1969 HE WAS ASSIGNED TO THE DUC TRONG DISTRICT HEADQUARTERS UNIT. BAO WAS COOPERATIVE DURING DEBRIEFINGS BUT HIS REPORTING RELIABILITY HAS NOT BEEN ESTABLISHED. THIS BIOGRAPHIC DATA IS THE RESULT OF FRELIMINARY DEBRIEFINGS AND IS SUBJECT TO CHANGE.

AN AMERICAN CONVOY CONSISTING OF FIVE OR SIX VEHICLES WAS AMBUSHED ABOUT 28 MAY 1970 ON HIGHWAY QLZØ (VICINITY BP230690) BY A 13 MAN VIET CONG (VC) ELEMENT. IN THE FIREFIGHT ONE AWERICAN WAS WOUNDED IN THE RIGHT LEG. HE WAS CAPTURED BY THE VC ELEMENT WHICH TOOK HIM TO THE SIGTH BATTALION HEADQUARTERS WHERE HE WAS GIVEN MEDICAL TREATMENT BY NURSE PHAN THIS UYEN PRIOR TO BEING INTERROGATED. 1.3(a)(4) SHORTLY AFTER HIS CAPTURE, THE PRISONER OF WAR (POW) WAS TRANSFERRED TO THE HEADQUARTERS OF THE MILITARY SECTION OF THE TUYEN DUC PROVINCE VC COMMITTEE BY HOANG B A O AND SIX VC GUARDS. THE POW WAS TURNED OVER TO FIRST LIEUTENANT DINH D A N. A 27 YEAR OLD NORTH VIETNAMESE WHO CAME SOUTH IN 1964. DAN WAS THE CHIEF. CHINH DICH VAN) OF THE ENEMY MILITARY TRANSPORTATION SECTION OF THE POLITICAL CADRE/PROPAGANDA SECTION OF THE TUYEN DUC PROVINCE MILITARY STAFF SECTION. (FIELD COMMENT: THE PRISONER PROBABLY WAS SPA KEITH ALBERT WHO WAS CAPTURED IN THIS AREA ON 21 MAY 1970.)

- 2. THE AMERICAN POW WAS SEEN DAILY BY DAO UNTIL HE WAS THANSFERRED TO THE CENTRAL OFFICE FOR SOUTH VIETNAM (COSVN) IN-LATE NOVENBER 1976. THE POW WAS CONSIDERED TO HAVE SURRENDERED BECAUSE HE HAD THROWN UP HIS KANDS AND RUN TOWARD THE VC POSITION. THE POW WAS NOT TIED WHILE UNDER DETENTION. THE POW TOLD BAD THAT ME WAS 21 YEARS OLD, WAS A SERGEANT, AND HAD TWO SISTERS, ONE OLDER AND ONE YOUNGER, AND A BROTHER WHO WAS ALSO SERVING IN SOUTH VIETNAM. THE POW BAID THAT HE WAS A HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATE AND PLANNED TO ENTER COLLEGE WHERE HE WANTED TO MAJOR IN ENGINEERING. HE SAID HIS NICKNAME WAS "MOCK". HE DID NOT HAVE NAME TAG ON HIS CLUTHES OR OTHER IDENTIFYING DATA TO CONFIRM HIS NAME OR RANK. HE WAS A WHITE MALE, ABOUT 6 FEET TWO INCHES TALL, WEIGHT ABOUT 150, THIN BUILD, BROWN HAIR, A BROWN BEARD, DARK COMPLEXION.
- 3. BAO SAID THAT ARRANGEMENTS WERE MADE BY HADIO THROUGH VC MILITARY REGION (MR) HEADQUARTERS TO TRANSFER THE POW TO COSVN HEADQUARTERS. (SOURCE COMMENT: MR-6 HEADQUARTERS WAS LCCATED TWO DAYS WALK FROM PHAN THIET CITY.) THE POW, ESCORTED BY LIEUTENANT DAM AND SIX GUARDS, WAS TO DEPART LAM DONG PROVINCE IN NOVEMBER AND PROCEED TO THE DONG NAI THUONG RIVER AND FROM THERE TO HIGHWAY 14, WHICH WOULD BE FOLLOWED TO THE CAMBODIAN BORDER. AT THE BURDER THE GROUP WAS TO BE MET BY AN ESCORT WHICH WOULD ASSIST IT IN REACHING COSVN HEADQUARTERS. PRIOR TO DEPARTING, THE POW MADE A TAPL CONCERNING HIS TREATMENT IN THE CAMP, AND GIVING HIS VIEWS ON THE WAR. THE GROUP LEFT IN EARLY NOVEMBER 1978. PRIOR TO DEPARTURE THE POW WAS ISSUED AN EXTRA SET OF LARGE SIZE BLACK PAJAMAD, A PAIR OF HO CHI MINK SANDALS, A VC HELMET, A BACK PACK FOR CANRYING RICE, A HAMMOCK, A PONCHO, CIGARETTES, A MOSQUITO NET AND ONE PAIR OF SOX.
- 4. ABOUT ONE WEEK AFTER DEPARTURE, THE GROUP SENT WORD TO THE TUYEN DUC VC COMMITTEE THAT THE ROUTE HAD BEEN BLUCKED BY AN

ALLIED OPERATION AND REQUESTED INSTRUCTIONS. AKRANGEMENTS WERE MAKE THROUGH VC MR-6 FOR AN ESCORT TO GUIDE THE GROUP TO HIGHWAY 14. AN ARVN MAJOR, LO VAN E, WHO HAD BEEN ATTENDING THE COMMAND AND GENERAL STAFF COLLEGE IN DALAT, TUYEN DUC PROVINCE, HAD BEEN CAPTURED IN NOVEMBER 1970 AND HE WAS SENT ALONG TO JOIN THE GROUP GOING TO CAMBODIA. (FIELD COMMENT: 'ARVN MAJOR LO VAN E WAS CAPTURED 15 NOVEMBER 1970 IN AN AMBUSH ON HIGHWAY QL 20.)
THE TUYEN DUC PROVINCE VC COMMITTEE RECEIVED WORD IN FEBRUARY 1971 THAT THE POWS AND ESCORT PARTY HAD REACHED COSVN SAFELY.

- PARTY RETURNED TO TUYEN DUC PROVINCE IN LATE MARCH 1971 AND REPORTED THAT THE POWS HAD BEEN IN GOOD HEALTH WHEN DELIVERED TO COSVN. DAN SAID THAT THE AMERICAN POW HAD APPEARED TO BECOME HEALTHIER AS THE THAIL BECAME MORE DIFFICULT AND HAD AT TIMES CARRIED THE PACKS OF THE GUARD FURCE.
- 6. DAN HAD HEARD THAT PLANES AS WELL AS VEHICLES WERE AVAILABLE TO CUSVN IF SECURITY PERMITTED AND IF THE POW WAS OF SUFFICIENT IMPORTANCE. HE SAID THAT ALL PRISONERS WERE TAKEN TO MORTH VIETNAM FOR INTERNMENT.
