

Synopais of Facts:

"Subject in interviews 6/16 and 23/51 furnished full background information. Subject believes he first set Julius ROSSYRAN at his parents' farm in Haddam, Converticut. Subject stated be once visited with MOSZNERO at MOSZNERO's home when he sade arrangements to drive him to the farm in Hadden, Connecticut. Subject admits visiting at EASNESEC's nachine shop, but denied having any business conversation with MISENSERO on behalf of himself and Raymond LOPEZ. Although subject stated he and Raymond LOFEZ entered a partnership to engage in import-export trade, they actually never did any business. Subject stated be never gave information concerning his work at the Kellex Corporation (Manhattan engineering project) to Julius ROSKNERG, and that ROSKNERG never questioned him about the work. Subject stated he joined the rederation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians at HTC in approximately 1910. Subject would not ensure any questions regarding present or past CP affiliation.


"On July 18, 1950 David CHEENGLASS advised that Russell McNUTT was an associate of Julius ROSENTANT, and possibly involved in Soviet espionage. CPMENGLASS advised that when McNUTT contacted ROSENTANG during 1946 concerning the possibility of acting as South American export representative for the G and R Engineering Company of New York City, McNUTT and his accommand by a 'partner'. According to GREENGLASS, McNUTT and his 'partner' visited the G and R Engineering Company a number of times while the export proposition was being planted. The 'partner', through his knowledge of Spanish, was to make the nocessary business contacts in South America. The 'partner' was to be paid by McNUTT one-half or one-third of McNUTT's calary until the export business got going. For reasons unknown to GREENGLASS, the export business never went into operation.

"The 'partner' referred to above has been identified as Raymond A LOFFI. a United States citizen who is presently residing at Caracas, Venezuela.

"It is noted that Julius ROCENSERS has been convicted for conspiracy to commit espicaage on behalf of the Soviet Government, and during April, 1951 was given the death sentence. David GREENGLASS entered a plea of guilty and during April, 1951 was given a sentence of 15 years.

"Subject Echur" was interviewed on June 16 and 23, 1951 by and the writer and furnished the following information.

*The subject attended grade school at La Cygne, Kansas; high school, Independence, Kansas; Junior College, Independence, Kansas (1932-1933); Kansas State College, Manhattan, Kansas (193h); Brooklyn Polytechnic Institute, Drooklyn, Hew York, 1937 to 1910 (attended evening sessions and received a Civil Engineering degree).

Employments

"HERVIT stated he has had the following employments:

"Forks Project Administration in New York City, 1935 or 1936 to 1939.

Phon York State Civil Service for the Dorough President of Manhattan, 1939 to February 1942 as an assistant engineer.

"Republic Steel Corporation, Port Heary, New York, February 1942 to October or Hovesber 1942. (Endle employed by Republic Steel Corporation, he resided at Forial and Mest Port, New York.)

EChemical Construction Corporation, a subsidiary of imerican Cyanasid Corporation, from November 1942 to approximately November 1943. Subject advised that he was engaged in structural steel designing work and that he was employed at New York City for the greater period of time, but recalled that he was assigned to a project at Cauctus Ordnance at Dumas, Texas for approximately three mouths.

The Rellex Corporation, a subsidiary of W. H. Kellogg, 233 Broadway, New York City, from November 1913 to June or July 1915. He stated that in connection with his work for the Kellex Corporation, he performed structural design of water cooling flumes at Oak Ridge, Tennessee. He stated, however, that for the greater part of time be was employed in the New York City office.

"Industrial Planners and Designers, Inc. (IPAD, Inc.), 1841 Proadway, New York City, from July 1945 to January, 1947.

"MCMUTT said that he invested approximately \$500.00 to \$600.00 in the Tab., Inc. at the time of its formation, and that he was made President of the concern. He advised that IRAD, Inc. was made up of a group of architects, miners and draftenen who all had office space at 18hh Broadway. McMUTT that he continues to be a stockholder in 1760, Inc. but that he was relieved of all duties and obligations of the concern at the time he want to South America in January, 19h7.

"He advised that they constructed a water supply line, installed coadsays, constructed a swiming pool and added other features that would also the property conductive to better living. He stated that the Yorktown project was not a success because immediately after the war, building terials and supplies were scarce and the project proved too costly.


"He added that the Yorktown Development Corporation is still an tive organization, and that be continues to hold stock in the concern.

rested initially in the Yorktown project. He stated that some of the cockholders in the Yorktown Development Corporation were Sigmand DIAMCND could's brother-in-last, Max SIMON, Harry MOHL (also an officer of LD, Inc.), Phillip SIMON (a brother of Max SIMON), and Julius mindlessed, in Invested approximately \$1,000.00 to \$15,000.00 in the Yorktown ovelopment Corporation.

"MCNUTT stated that he does not recall how Julius MCCNERG became interested in the Yorktown Development Corporation, but helieved he asked in the purchase stock in the corporation.

"Raymond Concrete Pile Company of Venezuela from January, 1947 to April, 1949, at Caracas, Venezuela.

"McMUTT advised that in December, 1946 he made application for malogment with the Raymond Concrete Pile Company, 140 Cedar Street, New look City, for a position with Raymond Concrete Pile Company of Venezuela. advised that he received the position of office engineer at Caracas and left the United States during January, 1947. He said that as office angineer for the Raymond Concern, he was responsible for all engineering arises going through the main office at Caracas. He also made all local turchases for the concern.



brother, Haldo McMUTT. He said that it was possible that Haldo was the one who took RCEINEAG to the farm for the first time. McMUTT thought that he saw RCEINEAG at his parents' farm on several other occasions.

EXCHUTT, when first questioned, stated that he never visited Julius FICKNEERS at his home, and then stated that it was possible that he visited FICKNEERS at his home about 19h0 or 19h1 when he arranged to drive FICKNEERS to the farm at Haddan. He stated he had never been in ROSENRERS home except on that occasion. He stated he does not recall where ROSENRERS was living at that time and did not recall whether he was living at Knickerbooker Willage or elsewhere.

"MCRUTT said that after meeting ROSKHERG, he recalled that on one occasion ROSKHERG, some time about 19h5 or 19h6, visited at MCRUTT's office of 19kB, Inc., 18h1 Broadway, New York City. He said that the purpose of this visit on the part of ROSKHERGO was to solicit work for his (ROSKHERG'S) machine shop on the lower East Side of New York City.

"MICHUTT further advised that he once accompanied ROSENEGED to his shop on the lower Rast Side of New York City, at which time he looked over the ROSENEERS seaching equipment.

"Meauly said that he did not remember meeting David GMARMGLASS at the time of accompanying ROSMHARMO to his shop. He denied having any business conversation with ROSFMERG and stated that when he visited ROSFMERG, he illchurt) was alone.

"At this point a photograph of Raymond A. LONEZ was exhibited to consult and he readily identified it. He said that he first not LONEZ while they were working together at the Kellex Corporation at New York City.

Le sivised that LONEZ left Kellex during 1914 to take a job with Groves - trake, Inc. at Caracas, Venezuela. He said that in that connection, LONEZ engaged in the construction of an equoduct for the Venezuelan government at Caracas. Memurical advised that LONEZ next returned to the United states some time during 1916. He said that LONEZ, after returning to the inited States, called him (Memuric) by telephone from Tamps, Florida. He contacted him, at which time he gave him 'glowing accounts' of business apportunities in South America.

"Then it was brought to Kenurr's attention that he had formed an cort-export firm, he recalled this fact and advised that LOPEZ, after ling him of the 'glowing accounts' of business opportunities in South rerica, and he entered into a partnership to engage in the import-export ad construction business in South America. He said that they entered a registration for the firm of McNUTT and LOPEZ, or LOPEZ and McNUTT, her York City at the time of forming this partnership. He said that many advertised their business on one occasion in the 'New York Sunday Times'.

"Venutt said that in connection with this partnership, he and LOPEZ and discussed business possibilities with approximately 15 to 20 individuals business firms. He said that even though they had made these various

business contacts, he and LOFEZ had never performed actual work of any kind whereby they received a commission, salary or any remineration. He added that the firm did not perform any duties whatsoever.

*McHUTT was then saked if he recalls visiting Julius ROSENZHO accompanied by Raymond A. LOHEZ at the O and R Engineering Company on the lower Rest Side of New York. McHUTT stated that he does not recall ever going to the O and R Engineering Company accompanied by Raymond LOHEZ. He further stated that he could not recall any agreement to share the profits with LOHEZ, and could not recall ever discussing with ROSENZEM any plan to export material to South America, through which LOHEZ was to receive one-half or one-third of the profits or salary received by McMUTT as a result of the export business engaged in on the part of McMUTT and LOHEZ for the O and R Engineering Company.

"At this point McNUTT would neither affirm nor deny that LOFEZ visited ROSENSEND at the O and R Engineering Company, stating that he could not recall any such instance.

MCNUTT stated that LOFEZ is presently employed as Chief Engineer for the Sales Department of the Creole Petroleum Corporation at Caracas, Venezuela. He said that LOFEZ travels quite often for the Creole Petroleum Corporation, but that he maintains his residence at Caracas.

"It will be further noted that David CREMULASS also advised that be recalls that he once ment to an architect's office near Columbus Circle and 59th Street, New York Citysto make a payment of about \$1,000.00 on the shares in a land development proposition at Yorktown Heights in Nestchester County, New York on behalf of Julius ROSENERG.

"MOBULT, when questioned concerning the above, stated that he does not recall Navid (MEXECIASS or any one else ever delivering a package containing approximately \$1,000.00 to the office of Industrial Planners and Designers, Inc.

"MCNUTT further advised that he believed he once received a letter from Julius ROSENERS while in South America. Herecalled that ROSENERS made a request for the liquidation of his interest in the Yorktown Development Corporation.

"Information Concerning Subject's Exployment with The Kellex Corporation (Manhattan Engineering Project)

"MCNUTT advised that he was performing drafting work on concrete fluxes while employed by The Kellex Corporation at Oak Ridge, Tennessee and New York City.

"He stated that in connection with the work performed at Kellex, he did not know what he was working on. Es was asked what he thought he was norking on and he replied that he did not know. In answer to the question



as to what he and his fellow-workers thought they were working on, he enseared that he and his fellow-engineers thought they were working on a high octane gasoline refinery or on a synthetic rubber plant. He stated they thought it could be a synthetic rubber plant because there was a lot of talk and newspaper articles about synthetic rubber at that time.

The was esked what necessity there was for concrete cooling flumes in either a high octane gasoline or synthetic rubber plant, and he stated he did not know. He was asked if he knew about the manufacturing processes of high octane gas and synthetic rubber today and he stated he did not know.

The was pointed out to him his speculation as to the work he was doing did not appear logical and he concrete that this was possible and he further admitted that the size of the concrete flowes he was working on made it apparent that the installation in which they were to be used was one which would generate tremendous quantities of heat. However, he still refused to admit that he know what he was doing.

"He stated that he had never discussed his work with Julius HOSSHERG or any one else, and that not even his wife knew what he was doing. He stated that he and all other employees of the Kellex Corporation were warned not to discuss their work with any one.

"He said that he never gave any information executing his work at Hellex to Julius HORNERG, and that ROSENERG never questioned him concerning his work.

"Information Concerning Subject's Co-Omership of Indian Lake Lodge, Indian Lake, New York

previously mentioned, advised that he could not recall any other such interest. Then it was brought to McNUTT's attention, he admitted that he purchased Indian lake Lodge in the Adirondacks with a Mr. les TIVES for \$17,000.00 in the spring of 19kl. He said that his wife Edge and Sally METER (wife of Lee METER) operated the lodge during the season (sugger months). He stated that at the time of buying Indian Lake Lodge, he was employed at the Kellex Corporation in New York City, and that he would go to the lodge on weekends to assist with the operation of it.

"He stated that he and HEIEER rade purchase of the lodge through a real estate agent at Olens Falls, New York. He said that a \$5,000.00 down payment was necessary and that he and HEIEER each paid \$2500.00 as his chare of the payment. EchVII stated that at the time of purchase he had approximately \$1,000.00 and it was then necessary for him to borrow 11,500.00 from his wife's parents.

"Volume explained that the lodge had accommodations for approximately 100 people and that they obtained guests by advertising in newspapers and by means of inviting associates to the lodge.

"Membership in Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians

"McNUTT stated that he was a number of the Federal of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicisms (FAECT), having joined the organization in New York City in approximately 1940. He advised that he could not recall the identity of the individual who solicited his membership in FAECT. He said that he attended meetings of the FAECT at a meeting hall somewhere downtown New York City, and could not recall which brench or unit of the organization he belonged to. NeWUTT said that he never knew Julius ROSKARIRO to be a member of the FAECT.

"Concerning the FARCT, the following is noted. On page 151 of the book entitled "A. Story of The CIO" by Benjamin STOLEGRO appears the following:

"*Only four CIO unions are under complete control of Stalinist officials."

"According to Denjamin STOLIKEC, listed among these four unions is the Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians.

"The following information regarding the FARCT appears on pages 264 and 265 of the above mentioned book by Mr. STOLERG:


"The Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians was organized in 193h mainly from the technical staff in the Works Project Administration. From the wary beginning the Federation has been under Stalinist leadership, and its rank and file are chiefly Communist Party followers."


"Photography Equipment Owned By Subject ...
