1. Reference is made to your cable 100-103 October 1950 in which you requested that ~~ROSENBURG~~ be contacted and queried regarding Julius ROSENBERG, who succeeded him as occupant of the apartment at 10 Monroe Street, New York City.

2. David NEPRAL was interviewed [REDACTED] on 25 January 1951. In reply to questions he stated that he did not know who took over his apartment when he left it in April 1942 and that he did not know ROSENBERG. The rental of the apartment, he said, was handled by the rental office of Knickerbocker Village (the housing development at 10 Monroe Street in which the [REDACTED] lived). He had no recollection of ever having seen the person who took over the apartment.

3. NEPRAL expressed the desire to be taking a well educated, solid, family type of man. He was straightforward and frank in his statement. He gave no explanation of his motivation or his intention during the interview, according to the report.
