SUBJECT: David KAPPEL
Espionage - R

1. Reference is made to your report dated 13 October 1950 in which you requested that David KAPPEL be contacted and queried regarding Julius ROSENBERG, who succeeded his late occupant of the apartment at 10 Monroe Street, New York City.

2. David KAPPEL was interviewed [redacted] on 25 January 1951. In reply to questions he stated that he did not know who took over his apartment when he left it in April 1942 and that he did not know ROSENBERG. The rental of the apartment, he said, was handled by the rental office of Knickerbocker Village (the housing development at 10 Monroe Street in which the apartment is located.) He had no recollection of ever having seen the person who took over the apartment.

3. KAPPEL expressed the interviewer as being a well educated, solid, friendly type of man. He was straightforward in his answers and showed no signs of nervousness or hesitation during the interview, according to the report.
