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... BY EVERETT ROBINSON, THE AUTHOR OF 'THE U-2 CASE', ...
 ... IN THE UNITED STATES, BROMIAREK SAYS THAT MANY FACTS
 DISCLOSED BY THE BOOK WERE PREVIOUSLY UNKNOWN. FOR EXAMPLE:
 THAT P-10'S CARRIED OUT SHORT-RANGE RECONNAISSANCE OVER THE
 SOVIET UNION IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE VICTORY OVER HITLERISM, THAT
 A MAJOR RECONNAISSANCE BY SE-7'S WAS STARTED IN 1950, THAT DOZENS
 OF AMERICAN PILOTS WERE ALONG THE SOVIET BORDER, THAT THE CIA
 SENT TEN LAWYERS FROM VIRGINIA TO GO TO MOSCOW TO INTERROGATE
 RUSSIAN AIR 'WAS AMERICAN INTELLIGENCE' ...
 ... THAT THE DECISION TO SEND U-2'S ON MAY DAY WAS
 MADE BY CIA OFFICERS AND NOT BY THE SUPREME POLITICAL ORGANS,
 THAT THE TOP OFFICIALS LOST CONTROL OVER THE U-2 PROGRAM
 WHICH WAS EMPLOYED BY LOWER LEVEL INTELLIGENCE SPECIALISTS,
 THAT THERE WAS NO CONSPIRACY TO TORPEDO A SUMMIT MEETING BUT
 THAT INTELLIGENCE PEOPLE WERE AFRAID A SUMMIT MEETING MIGHT
 TORPEDO THE U-2 PROGRAM, AND THAT U-2 MISSIONS WERE FROM TIME
 TO TIME INTERRUPTED WHEN DIPLOMACY REQUIRED IT.

... BROMIAREK POINTS OUT THAT THE BOOK ADMITS
 ... INDICATION THAT THE P-10 WHICH WAS SHOT DOWN SHORTLY AFTER
 THE U-2 WAS A SPY PLANE. HE RECALLS THE INDIGNATION OF THE U.S.
 PRESS WHEN THE SOVIET UNION REFUSED TO LET THE TWO VIRGINIA
 LAWYERS REPRESENT POWERS AND THE PROTESTS OF THE WESTERN PRESS
 THAT THE SOVIET UNION WAS GUILTY OF TORPEDOING THE 1960
 SUMMIT. HE WRITES: "IN CONCLUSION LET US ASK A QUESTION,
 ONE OF PROBABLE INTEREST TO POLISH READERS: WHY HAS THIS BOOK
 BEEN PUBLISHED AT ALL? I THINK THAT HAD NIXON WON THE ELECTIONS
 IT WOULD HAVE BEEN LESS POSSIBLE TO HAVE IT PUBLISHED."

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DISCLOSED BY THE BOOK WERE PREVIOUSLY UNKNOWN. FOR EXAMPLE, THAT P-15'S CARRIED OUT SHORT-RANGE RECONNAISSANCE OVER THE SOVIET UNION IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE VICTORY OVER AUSTRIA, THAT PLANNED RECONNAISSANCE BY SR-47'S WAS STARTED IN 1950, THAT LOGS OF AMERICAN PILOTS RAN ALONG THE SOVIET BORDER, THAT THE CIA ASKED 100 LAWYERS FROM VIRGINIA TO GO TO MOSCOW TO INTERROGATE POWERS FOR "THE AMERICAN INTELLIGENCE" GROUP I MENTIONED IN REFERENCE TO, THAT THE DECISION TO SEND U-2'S ON ANY DAY WAS MADE BY CIA OFFICERS AND NOT BY THE SUPREME POLITICAL GROUPS, THAT THE TOP OFFICIALS LOST CONTROL OVER THE U-2 PROGRAM WHICH WAS RUN BY LOWER LEVEL INTELLIGENCE SPECIALISTS, THAT THERE WAS NO CONSPIRACY TO TORPEDO A SUMMIT MEETING BUT THAT INTELLIGENCE PEOPLE WERE AFRAID A SUMMIT MEETING MIGHT TORPEDO THE U-2 PROGRAM, AND THAT U-2 MISSIONS WERE FROM TIME TO TIME INTERRUPTED WHEN DIPLOMACY REQUIRED IT.

IN CONCLUSION, BROSIARSK points out that the book admits by implication that the SR-47 WHICH WAS SHOT DOWN SHORTLY AFTER THE U-2 WAS A SPY PLANE. HE RECALLS THE INDIGNATION OF THE U.S. PRESS WHEN THE SOVIET UNION REFUSED TO LET THE TWO VIRGINIA LAWYERS REPRESENT POWERS AND THE PROTESTS OF THE WESTERN PRESS THAT THE SOVIET UNION WAS GUILTY OF TORPEDOING THE 1960 SUMMIT. HE WRITES: "IN CONCLUSION LET US ASK A QUESTION, ONE OF PROBABLE INTEREST TO POLISH READERS: WHY HAS THIS BOOK BEEN PUBLISHED AT ALL? I THINK THAT HAD NIXON WON THE ELECTIONS IT WOULD HAVE BEEN LESS POSSIBLE TO HAVE IT PUBLISHED."

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
