rather, it is necessary to find joint solutions enabling us to bring about the economic improvement of workers, greater participation by all the productive sectors in the decisions affecting the country's economic development, genuine nonalignment, democracy, effective pluralism, freedom and respect for human rights.

The democratic and independent sectors, or opposition parties, continue despite our natural reserve due to the results of prior meetings, and despite the irregularities of the invitation, which does not include an agenda of topics to be discussed to achieve national unity, and due to civic and patriotic spirit that inevitably moves us, we think this appeal should constitute the beginning of a broad process of dialogue, the results of which should be the fruit of a general effort.

Aware of the responsibility that this represents, immediately after the meeting we will report to the people on its results, the document says in conclusion.

The document is signed by the Nicaraguan Democratic Movement, the Nicaraguan Social Democratic Party, the Social Christian Party, the Nicaraguan Workers Federation, the Confederation for Unity of Trade Unions and the Higher Council of Private Enterprises. The latter did not participate in this afternoon's meeting with the members of the FMLN National Directorate.

#### Organizations' View of Meetings

[Text] Five political organizations and two unions this afternoon described their first meeting with the National Directorate of the Sandinista National Liberation Front (FSLN) as positive and fruitful, as both an advance and the beginning of a national consensus regarding what is and should be the defense of the revolution.

The representatives of the Constitutionalist Liberal Movement (MLC), the Nicaraguan Democratic Movement, MDC, the Democratic Conservative Party, the Social Christian Party (PSC), the Nicaraguan Workers Federation, CTA and the Confederation for Unity of Trade Unions, CUS, met behind closed doors from 1430 to 1700 with Luis Carrion and Bayardo Arce, members of the National Directorate and commanders of the revolution.

This second meeting sponsored by the National Directorate has underscored the importance of the national dialogue begun by the FSLN.

Some of the delegates were: Adelfo Calero, Minister of Agriculture and Dr. Clemente Galdo for the traditional conservatives; Alvaro Jaramila for the MDC, Juan Antonio and Angel Jimenez for the PSC; Dr. Enrique Garcia Guerrero for the MLC and several CUS and CTA members.

We feel it is worth reporting all developments at this meeting because of their scope and because it is necessary for our people to hear about and become familiar with the leaders' activities and opinions.

Jose Espinosa, CUS delegate to the State Council, has described the meeting as a fruitful dialogue. He is one of the first union delegates to air his views on the national dialogue.

We continue with this national poll on this afternoon's developments in Managua in connection with the national dialogue. The bases for unity as interpreted by the MDC have not been laid, but explanations were given on the type of political views held by the country's various sectors.
