

1. The twelve photographs (#2-13) of Major Carl D. Miller and one photograph (#1) of an unidentified American prisoner of war have been viewed and compared. It is the belief of the undersigned that the American prisoner of war (shown in photograph #1) could very well be Major Carl D. Miller.

2. Although photograph #1 is of poor quality, the features of the person therein bear a marked resemblance to the features of Major Miller:

a. The POW's ear and ear lobe are similar to Major Miller's (a triangular ear with a descending lobe).

b. Both noses appear similar (being large, tip down and well-developed).

c. Major Miller has obvious forehead wrinkles (photographs #2, #4 and #5). These wrinkles are evident in the POW photograph.

d. Brows appear heavy and set close to eye.

e. Although the hairline in the POW picture is not too evident, it could well be similar to Major Miller's hairline.

f. Because of the poor quality of photograph #1, we were unable to compare, fully, features such as eyes, lips, and chinline. From what can be seen, however, there is a good possibility of these features being similar to Major Miller's.
