Antonio Cattonar¹ of the pro-Cominform Sindacati Unici has asked Furlan (fnu)² of the Comitato Aziendale to write a letter of protest to President Truman demanding the immediate commutation of the Rosenberg sentences and condemning the "brutal methods" used against them.

1. Washington Comment: SO-81069 reports the anti-American propaganda promoted by Cattonar in Trieste. SO-88385 reports on the Vidali Party attitude towards the Cattonar "case" involving the expulsion of Cattonar's wife and two daughters from the Free Territory of Trieste when their United States passports were discovered to be not valid for the area.
2. Washington Comment: Possibly Oscar Ferlan, pro-Cominform Central Committee member.
