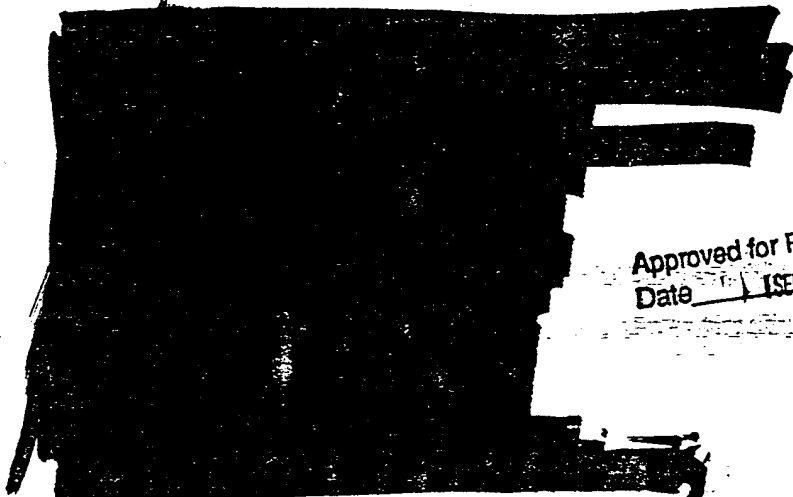

The following information was taken from a letter written by A. G. Massevitch, Assistant Chairman of the Astronomical Council of Sciences of the USSR [REDACTED]

1. We (Soviets) have begun with the organization of MOONWATCH stations. We have appealed to all Soviet astronomers to take part in this work.
2. We are counting on an orbit with the angle of inclination of 60°, but several southern stations are so situated that they will be able to participate in observing the American satellite. All this work is being coordinated by the Astronomical Council of the Academy of Sciences of the USSR.
3. We are not engaged in amateurs' radio-observations, but as far as I know, they are also being organized. Our satellite will work on frequencies 20 and 40 Mc.
