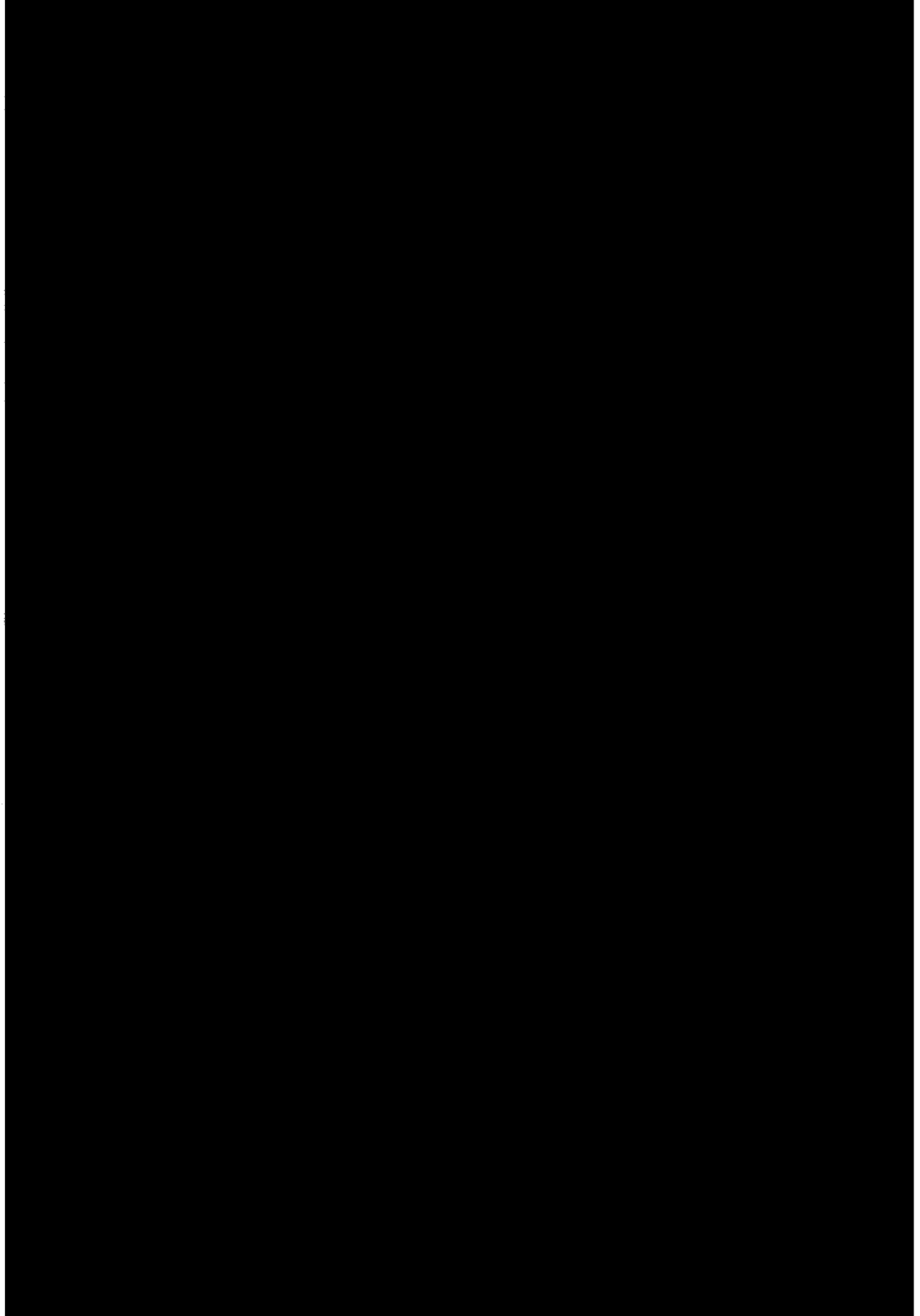

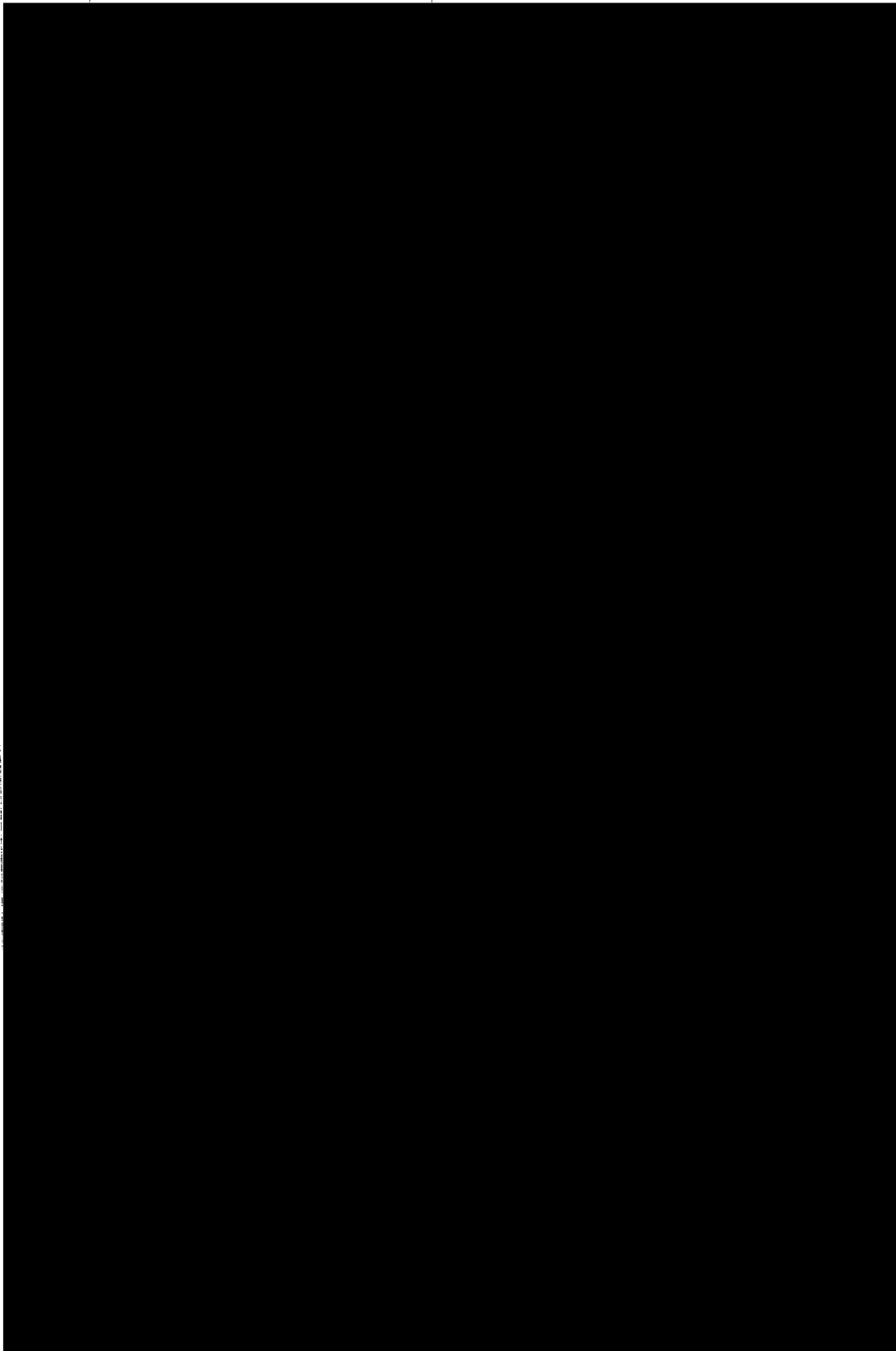

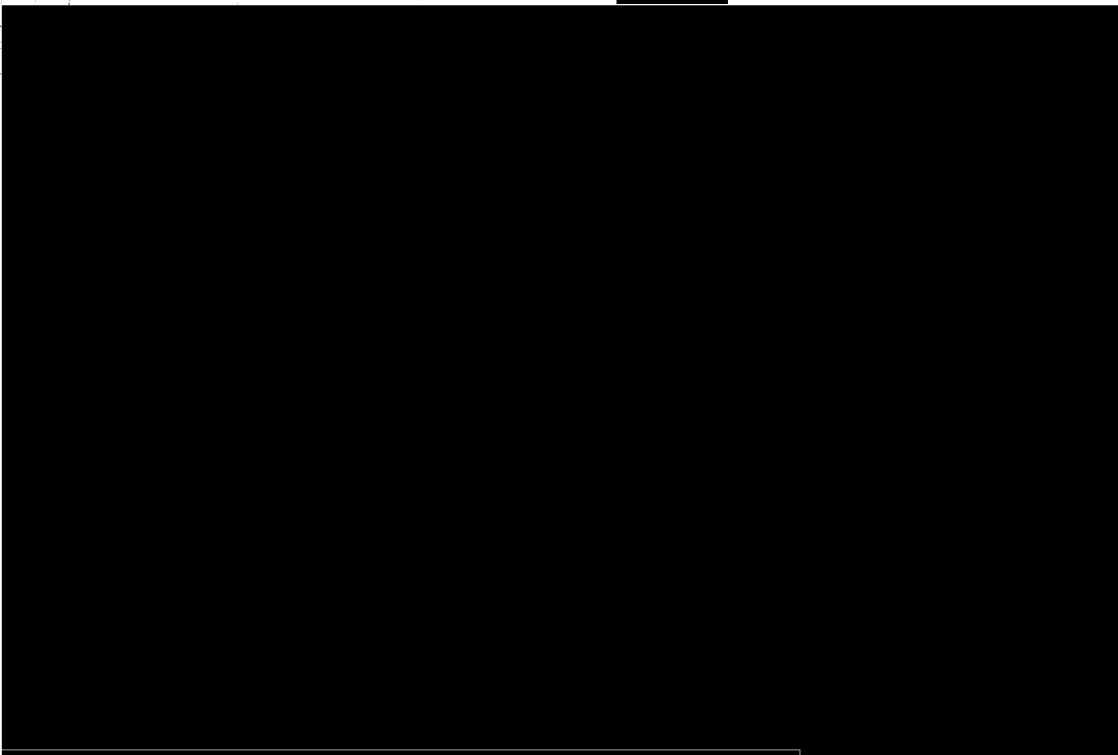

USSR-Chile-Cuba

Chilean Communist Party leader Luis Corvalan, whose release from a Chilean prison was "exchanged" for the Soviet release of president Vladimir Bukovsky, arrived in the USSR on Saturday. A welcoming motorcade and Kremlin reception were postponed in order not to detract from General Secretary Brezhnev's birthday celebration over the weekend.

In Zurich, Bukovsky met with a number of other prominent Soviet exiles and held a press conference detailing his experiences in the USSR. He said he intends to visit supporters in the UK and the US and noted that he eventually hopes to resume his biology studies, possibly in the Netherlands.

Publicity surrounding the exchange puts added pressure on Cuba to respond to the other half of the Chilean offer: to exchange the number two Chilean communist leader, Jorge Montt, for Castro's best known political prisoner, Huber Matos. Havana media gave very little play to the Bukovsky-Corvalan exchange, however, suggesting that Cuba is not likely to follow the Kremlin's lead. ■
