## Regime Expected to Commute Four Death Sentences in Chile

The four death sent near handed down in Chile by an air force court-muted by higher military authorities. Other sentences, ranging from 300 days to life in prison, may also be reduced on appeal.

The public trials of the defend-

ences in Chile

anta-mostly military men-began in
April and ended late last month. The
most serious charges involved the
passage of military secrets to the
"enemy" and leftist attempts to promote insubordination in the sir force.
Carlot Lazo, former president of the
state bank, received one of the death
sentences, and former Socialist senator
Eric Schnake got 20 years.

Since the trials were by wartime
court-martial, appeals may be taken
only to higher military authorities. The
junta will have the final word on the
death sentences, but it is doubtful that
any of the condemned men actually

any of the condemned men actually will be executed.

The military government has grown increasingly aware of the damage that executions have done to Chile's interactional image. All death sentences handed down by military courts so far this year have been commuted.
