

## YUGOSLAVIA: Crackdown Continues

As Yugoslav authorities continue their crackdown, dissident intellectuals are beginning to stage protests. The party this week expelled one of the recent detainees and a journalist, Leading dissident Milovan Djilas, meanwhile, has attacked Beigrade's repressive tactics in an interview in the Austrian press, and the continuous continuous details are drafting a protest addressed to federal authorities for cosigning by members of Serbian and Croatian associations.

Belgrade seems determined to continue the repression while trying to justify its actions at home and abroad. Djilas, by launching a swift public attack on the authorities, almost certainly believes that Western sympathy will either protect him from further reprisals or at least make it embarrassing for the authorities if they move against him. An uncorroborated story—reported in the West German press and quoting dissident sources—that one dissident had died in Belgrade may reflect heightening passions in intellectual circles.
