Former KGB General Oleg Kalugin, whose unconfirmed allegation that KGB investigated American prisoners in 1978, will testify at the open hearing on this issue before the committee on 21 January. Kalugin secretly met with this committee as soon as he arrived in the United States last week to promote his book on the August 1991 coup d'etat in the Soviet Union.

During a meeting with the Foreign Relations Council in Los Angeles on 13 January, Kalugin once again affirmed that none of the American prisoners held captive in Vietnam had been **sent** to the Soviet Union.
