This is the second time such news coverage has been spread to deny positive efforts taken by Vietnam in the settlement to the American servicemen missing in action in the Vietnam war. First time, it appeared in the former Soviet Union and the second time in Washington. But both of them were rebutted by political circles in the former Soviet Union and the United States.

..TEXT:

THE WASHINGTON POST (?in its latest) issue reported that the Central Intelligence Agency, CIA, rejected the news and said that they have kept no profiles showing that American prisoners of war in Vietnam were transferred to the former Soviet Union or still alive. The spokesman for the Russian Embassy in Washington on Wednesday denied the news and said that it did not hold that any American prisoners of war were **sent** to his country and that this is just a fabrication.

In his recent visit to Vietnam, American Senator John Kerry who was heading an American Senate delegation affirmed that there was no evidence on American prisoners of war still being kept in Vietnam or still alive. He made a remark out of his tour of some live sighting places in Vietnam. So that was the truth.

A Vietnamese Foreign Ministry spokesman on Wednesday, once again, affirmed that Vietnam did not **send** to the former Soviet Union any Americans either people who had surrendered of their own accord or people who were deserters or prisoners of war.
