((YEL'TSIN))'S ANNOUNCEMENT ON 16 JUNE THAT U.S. PRISONERS OF WAR
(POW) WERE SENT TO THE FORMER SOVIET UNION AND THAT SOME OF THESE
POWS STILL MAY BE ALIVE CONTRADICTS EARLIER JOINT STATEMENTS MADE BY

POWS TO THE FORMER SOVIET UNION, AND VIETNAM WANTS TO DOWNPLAY THE ISSUE TO AVOID TENSIONS BETWEEN THE THREE COUNTRIES. THEREFORE, ON 21 JUNE, THE VIETNAMESE MFA ISSUED GUIDANCE TO ALL VIETNAMESE MISSIONS AND MFA PERSONNEL ASSIGNED ABROAD ON ACCEPTABLE REPLIES TO ANY INQUIRES THAT MAY ARISE ON THE ISSUE. VIETNAMESE OFFICIALS ARE TO EMPHASIZE THAT VIETNAM DID NOT SEND ANY U.S. POWS TO THE FORMER SOVIET UNION DURING OR AFTER THE VIETNAM WAR, AND THEY ARE TO EXPLAIN THAT VIETNAM REJECTS SUCH INFORMATION AS FALSE.
