MEMORANDUM FOR: DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE

SUBJECT : Conference with SEEKFORD

Conference of [ ] and SEEKFORD on 31 July, and [ ]  
[ ] and SEEKFORD 1 August developed the following points:

1. SEEKFORD has maintained excellent cover [

the States is easily explained, but failure to return to his post  
would be most suspicious. ]

2. SEEKFORD has met with CALLIGERIS on eight occasions, but  
has been very discreet in his meetings and is confident that his  
association is known only to [ ]

3. SEEKFORD has apparently gained CALLIGERIS' complete con-  
fidence as the representative of an anti-Communist group in the  
United States. CALLIGERIS has discussed his plans and problems  
frankly and seemingly without reservation. After discussions with  
SEEKFORD, CALLIGERIS has developed a revised plan which involves  
the following variations on the original:

a. Smuggling arms to his people within his country  
and mounting revolt primarily from within the country  
rather than as invasion from outside.

b. Elimination of requirement for bomber and fighter  
aviation.

c. Reduction of requirement for combat shipping to  
point where local shipping will serve.

d. Reduction of requirement for communications equip-  
ment.

e. Elimination of requirement for kitchens and food-  
stuffs.

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f. Addition of requirement for time bombs and demolitions.

g. Movement of personnel and materiel by air after combat operation is mounted.

4. SEEKFORD is confident that CALLIGERIS' revised plan will guarantee success if financial and materiel assistance is forthcoming. SEEKFORD will confer with Barba Roja regarding the revised plan on 5 August at 1830.

5. SEEKFORD stresses necessity for:

a. Financial assistance. (This essential if kitchens and foodstuffs eliminated.)

b. Delivery of original list of arms and munitions or acceptable substitutes.

c. Delivery of one 50 or 75 watt transmitter with receiver. (CALLIGERIS has a 50 watt and a 75 watt set now operating within his country.)

d. Delivery of a minimum of two walkie-talkies and two signal pistols with ammunition.

e. Delivery of up to 100 time bombs and a small quantity of demolition supplies.

f. Availability of transport planes.

g. Assignment of RAZMARA for local supervision of PW.

6. SEEKFORD agrees with CALLIGERIS that operation should be undertaken in September. The latter's present plans are based on the assumption of having outside assistance. SEEKFORD believes CALLIGERIS will make the attempt even without such assistance, but does not believe that an attempt without outside assistance can be successful.

7. SEEKFORD, CALLIGERIS and [ ] are convinced that the best solution is green light to friend to south and shipment of materiel to him for further distribution by CALLIGERIS. They also feel that this friend may provide transport aviation. It will require four weeks to place the materiel in the hands of CALLIGERIS' people after it is made available to him.

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8. SEEKFORD has been able to verify all of CALLIGERIS' statements except for the extent of his support within his country. SEEKFORD states that he has never heard the name ~~KMEGGCUP~~ mentioned by CALLIGERIS as one of the people with whom he is co-operating.

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9. SEEKFORD feels that he must be able to tell CALLIGERIS what aid he can expect and when he can expect it upon his return.

10. The following list of arms has been requested (to come out of original list) to be smuggled into CALLIGERIS' country prior to mounting of operations:

√ Sub-machine guns	260 w/1,000 rounds each
√ Pistols	900 w/200 rounds each
{ Hand Grenades (explosive)	1600
{ Hand Grenades (incendiary)	150
{ Time Bombs	40
{ Road Mines	25
{ Signal Pistols	35 w/10 rounds each

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
