- 1. Subject, a Guatemalan citizen born 4 October 1932, arrived in Panama 22 April 1953 from San Jose, Costa Rica, and departed 4 May 1953, for Guayaquil, Ecuador, During that time he is reported to have passed bad checks in excess of \$500.00. He returned to Panama screetime in 1954 and apparently has straightened out the bad check matter.
- 2. He went to the American Embassy during the latter part of May 1954, and stated that he had been a member of the Communist Party in Guatemala, knew of Communist activity in Panama at this time and wished to cooperate with the United States.
- 3. BERTHOLE presents a good appearance with a pleasant manner somewhat too friendly. He refused to allow himself to be pinned down on any points concerning specific information on Guatemalan Communism or Communists in Panama, stated that he was receiving mail through the Guatemalan Embassy, was friendly with the Guatemalan Consul, and in a position to gather valuable data. He pointed out that since he had two years of military school he was well versed in such matters. He was living with friends who had no phone and could not be contacted without the arranging of a prior meeting place. He wanted to be guaranteed escape from Panama in the event he should get in trouble. He claimed to be a nephew of the murdered Col. ARAMA, and wished to get even with the Communists for murdering his uncle. The relationship is through his father whose last name is ARAMA.
- 5. On 18 June, subject revisited the imbassy and saked to see \(\subseteq \) lie was told \(\subseteq \subseteq \text{Jwas out of town.} \) He stated that he had not kept his appointment since he had obtained a job which prevented his being at the designated spot at the agreed upon time. The Embassy, following expressed wishes \(\subseteq \subseteq \text{Jwas not inclined to discuss matters with him.} \)
