FUR A NEW GENEVA SESSION CAP ITS CAMPAIGN TO COURT INTERNATIONAL PUBLIC OPINION BEFORE THE VOTE ON THE ANNUAL AFGHAN RESOLUTION IN THE UN GENERAL ASSEMBLY THIS FALL. ISLAMABAD WILL CITE KABUL'S FAILURE TO MAKE A SIGNIFICANT BREAKTHROUGH ON THE TIMETABLEAN EXPECTATION THE SOVIETS THEMSELVES PROMOTEDTO COUNTER MOSCOW'S EFFORTS TO PERSUADE THOSE WHO DOUBTED KABUL'S GOOD INTENTIONS, ALTHOUGH MOSCOW AND KABUL ARE STILL LIKELY TO REGISTER SOME GAINS.	
MOSCOW MAY HAVE WANTED KABUL TO PROPOSE A 12-MONTH TIMETABLE BUT BECAME CONVINCED AFTER THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE GENEVA RESUMPTION THAT THE AFGHAN REGIME COULD NOT SUSTAIN AN OFFER THAT PAKISTAN MIGHT ACCEPT. ALTERNATIVELY, THE SOVIETS MAY HAVE MISCALCULATED THAT WELL-FOUNDED RUMORS OF A 12-MONTH TIMETABLE WOULD INDUCE PAKISTAN TO MOVE ITS OWN OFFER CLOSE TO 12 MONTHS.	
ISLAMABAD WOULD PROBABLY HAVE AGREED TO A 12-MONTH TIMETABLE BUT MAY HAVE BEEN RELUCTANT TO MAKE AN OFFER THAT WOULD ENDANGER US AID. ONCE THE AID ISSUE IS DECIDED, PAKISTAN MAY TRY TO USE A 12-MONTH OR SHORTER TIMETABLE TO PROD THE RESISTANCE INTO ACCEPTING COMMUNIST PARTICIPATION IN A COALITION.
