

(C) This letter responds to Senator Thompson's letter of 21 July 1997, requesting the addition of Chief Counsel Mike Madigan to the list of designated staff authorized access to CIA information. Mr. Madigan's name will be added to the list, and a copy of this letter will be sent to the Office of Senate Security. I would note that the number of staff authorized access to CIA information has increased from six to nine since our original letter of approval on 28 March 1997. The purpose of the restricted staff access is to ensure the security of sensitive CIA operational information and, as we discussed this morning, we must immediately address the number of staff who have access to our material.
