Dear Mr. Soobzokov,

Your assessment report is nearly complete and I shall be informing you concerning it in a few days.

What I am writing to you about now is your friend in Jordan with the disabled arm. We will be glad to do what we can to "push" his immigration to the U. S. provided you will take the following steps:

1. Check with the immigration authorities in NYC concerning what forms, if any, are required to guarantee a person's immigration to the U. S.

2. Write a letter to the U. S. Consul in Amman, attaching all necessary forms, guaranteeing support for your friend in the United States. This guarantee must be accompanied by some sort of proof that you have the means to back it up. Either you will have to show financial resources or obtain an affidavit from your employer in this regard. The immigration authorities in New York will be able to give you the precise information. You must, in the letter of guarantee, recognize the physical disability of your friend.

3. When you write the letter to the U. S. Consul in Amman, send me a copy ☐. In this way, I think they will be able to exert influence in the case.

My congratulations on your having received your insurance appointment. It attests to your ability and initiative.
