## WATCH COMMITTEE CONCLUSIONS--13 September

No Sino-Soviet bloc country intends to initiate direct military action in the immediate future.

Berlin: The Communists continue to allege Allied misuse of the air corridors. The possibility remains that the Communists may attempt harassment of Western civil air access to West Berlin.

There are no signs that either Pakistan or Afghanistan is prepared to compromise their current differences. Both sides have irregular tribal forces in the border area, and there is the possibility of a clash between these forces or between regular military forces.
