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At the request of the Chief of Base, DTRULER, an audit of the DTLINEN finances was undertaken. Arrangements were made for meetings in a safe house between the auditors, the bookkeeper for the overt activities and the chief of the covert activities of DTLINEN.

OVERT ACTIVITIES

The bookkeeper brought with him a multi-columned ledger-journal combination, which he stated was the entire bookkeeping system of the overt operation. This covered the period from 1 April 1952 through the present time (5 Bovember 1952). This book was broken down into the following columns: Cash, Post Office Account, Bank Account, Receipts, Contributions from various peoples, Salaries, Heat, Light, Power, Rent and Cleaning, Office Supplies, Postage and Phone, Furniture, Auto Expense, Miscellaneous Costs, Social Expense - political prisoner (support, travel), Social Expense - refugees and miscellaneous aid (support and travel), Social Expense - miscellaneous, Social Expense - medicaments, Propaganda Cost - printing, Arrangement Costs, Propaganda Costs - payment for composition, Propaganda - travel.

The columns in this took were added and balanced across for June and October. These two months were chosen by the auditors for a test check basis and the DTLINEN people had no idea which months would be audited. October was chosen because, while the book was completely posted, it had not been consolidated into statements. June was selected because it seemed to be the largest month in transaction volume.

The auditors asked for the supporting receipts, and when they were supplied, checked them for accuracy and authenticity. Thus the flow of money was checked into the book, into receipted disbursements, into a break-down of expense and into the final financial statement. A translated copy of the October Statement is attached (Schedule A).

The auditors were not able to verify cash on hand since the audit was conducted in a safe house, nor were they able to verify office equipment, automobiles or any other non-expendable equipment. According to financial statements and the cash book, very small balances remained at the close of books each month.

The receipts were all presented. Those covering rent, phone, light and similar overhead charges were apparently bona fide commercial receipts. Salary payments were supported by receipts signed by the various individuals. The auditors also saw the payroll summary cards maintained by the bookkeeper. They were not shown the receipts from the German Labor Office for taxes paid on the salaries. Receipts for aid to refugees were form receipts signed by various people; the auditors could not check the authenticity of these receipts. Frinting costs were supported by form receipts with attached money order receipts. Receipts for medicaments were supported by two form receipts signed by a Dr. Wolfgang and other individuals. No breakdown as to what was purchased was given. Examples of the various expenses are:

When questioned by the auditors as to source of funds, the book-keeper knew they received 31,500.00 DM from Ford Foundation, 5,000.00 DM from Berlin Senate, 3,500.00 DM from Thomsen and some small contributions from individuals. Various larger sums were, as far as he knew, from Tillich or Biermann, other than that he knew nothing as to the source. He maintained a column in his book called group seven. In this column he entered, for tax purposes, salaries of the covert operation. Funds were advanced, by Tillich or Biermann to cover this expense.

The bookkeeper also maintained one additional column for a subbase at Gottingen. This was charged for funds advanced and credited for funds accounted for. The base expenses were combined in the overall report.

We discovered bases were maintained at Friedberg, Gottingen, Giessen, and one other town, presumably where refugee centers are located, for counseling refugees. No evidence existed of any bases outside of Germany, and none in Germany other than those listed.

Attached is a copy of the overt budget estimate prepared by the head bookkeeper (Schedule B). Salaries are given in detail. It should be noted that the following bonuses are paid by the covert section in addition to the salaries shown under the overt section.

These bonuses are not reported to the German government for tax purposes.

It should be noted that the covert salaries were, until the first of October, included in the overt books in order to meet tax requirements. Beginning the first of October, however, the only record of these salaries will be on the covert books, with an entry on the overt books for the tax to be paid to the German Labor Office. It would appear that under close inspection by the German government a question would immediately arise as to where these salaries were paid and accounted for.

COVERT ACTIVITIES

The covert section book was divided into the following columns:

(June and October costs are shown). (1) Cash, (2) Receipt of Cash, (3) Bonations, (4) Salaries and bomises (June 3,300.00, October 3,595.00), (5) Rents, repairs, packing paper, office supplies, cleaning, coal, electricity and water (June 1,071.17, October 1,751.07), (6) Furniture and Equipment (June - 0 -, October 1,533.45), (7) Postage and Phone (June 4,58.00, October 4,70.40), (8) Auto expenses - 3 cars in Berlin, 2 in West Germany (June 5,70.51, October 1,045.07), (9) Travel Costs, cigarettes, soap, etc. to contacts for distribution in five East German Landkreis, meetings, etc. (June 9,642.28, October 6,561.67), (10) Costs involved in escape from Berlin (June - 0 -, October 410.00), (11) Printing, purchasing balloons, propaganda mailing, etc. (June 4,430.37, October 2,885.05), (12) Payment for information (June 256.00, October 806.71), (13) Security costs - continual changing of offices (June 165.25, October - 0 -), (14) Salaries and operational expenses in commection with distributing propaganda in the two offices in Test Germany (June 950.00, October 993.26).

An estimated cost of salaries for the covert section which heretofore appeared on a reimbursable basis on the overt section books is as follows:

One land chief also has a secretary who is paid hourly on a part-time basis.

The covert section has transferred to the overt section, in addition to reimbursable salaries as noted above, 53,570.87 DM during the period 1 May 1952 to 31 October 1952. Of this, 11,543.00 DM was for special work, and

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23,000.00 DM was for purposes. This leaves 19,027.87 DM direct support of overt activities by covert funds, in addition to 1,800.00 DM bonus to overt employees monthly from covert funds.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. We should be presented a monthly statement giving as much detail as Schedule A. This would be far superior to those submitted under ENB-A-2hl and is currently being prepared by DTLINEN's bookkeeper for their own use.
- 2. An effort should be made to determine where the 4,800.00 DM in October 1952 and the 147.50 DM in June 1952 differences occurred. The 4,800.00 DM might be recorded in the November report.
- 3. The security problem involved in reporting covert salaries to the German Labor Office should be investigated.
- h. An investigation of the overt books might well cause speculation concerning the source of funds stated to have been received from Tillich or Biermann but which are in reality covert funds from us. This security problem should be investigated.
- 5. The list of employees should be closely studied to make certain that unnecessary personnel are not being paid.
- To. Funds given to Tillich should be recorded in total on the covert books as soon as he receives them. By recording subsequent transfers as they occur, a running balance can be kept. No unexplained differences could occur. This would not involve a security risk since these books are not available to the German authorities.
- 7. It is recommended that the group be requested to furnish a schedule of all non-expendable equipment. This schedule should list by item, date of acquisition, purchase price and present condition.
