Wikolai KHCKHLOV has completed a book detailing his experiences and explaining his motives in defecting. This book has been add in France. The story will also be coristized there. Apparently there are some opportunities in Denmark and Western Germany. According to subject, the proparation of the English language version is progressing smoothly. Further information on his forthcoming book is supplied in the attachment. 2. KHOKELOV currently plans to return to Europe on or about 12 February 1958. He claims he would prefer to romain in the United States. He says on many occasions he has definitely committed himself to the public that he will continue the enti-Communist fight but now feels that he would be deluged with adverse propaganda if he restained in the US, even though he could do as much to eradicate the Soviet regime in the US as in Europe. He believen he must forsake the possibilities of a good life to parsue his cause. He has stated a desire to work with USIS in Europe. SUBJECT: Forthcoming Book by Mikolay AHORHLOV (DC-2076)

- 1. Ilkolai KHCKHLOV has completed a book detailing his experiences and explaining his metives in defecting. He is particularly interested in exenerating himself from the charge that in his first rublic statements in 1954 his needlesely implicated his wife, who remained behind in the UCCR. as the moving spirit behind his refucal to carry out his assussination mission. To accomplish this objective, he tells the entire history of the hardling of his case by American intelligence. He is careful not to reveal identifies of any the Americans connected with his case, whom he admits gave him sympathetic treatment, but the picture he paints of their actuteness is by no means complimentary. As an example, his manuscript details how he was induced to corporate in a publicity play, only after a premise was made him by a US intelligence efficer that the US Embassy in Moseow would request local US newspaper correspondents to go to his wife's flat in L'occov a few minutes after his VOA broadcast to tip her off on the situation, and hint the might find asylum in the US Embassy. A reference to this episodo which KHOKHLGV rolors to as the "Mozzow Embassy Plan" appeared in an article in the Caturday Evening Post in late 1934.
- 2. KHCKHLOV submitted his manuscript to CIA for a roviou. He agreed to certain minor alterations, but refused to alter any of its main points. Little, if anything, can be done to presoure him to do so. He has obtained permanent US residence by virtue of a Special Bill passed on his behalf by the Congress. He has consistently avoided being placed under obligation to this Agency.
- 3. A few chapters of his book have already appeared in the NTO Russian-language newspaper Person published in Germany. This same organization will shortly publish all of KHCKHLOV's material in book form. So far as is known, he has not an yet found a publisher in the US although he is actively cocking one. It is difficult to estimate in advance whether KHCKHLOV's book when published abroad, or if published here, will cause any real embarraesment to the US intelligence community.
