My dear Mr. Paige:

Reference is made to your recent request for information from the records of this Service relative to Paul Tschelitscheff and General Professor Golovin. Your file 14-10,937-2 relates.

The files of this office show that Paul Tschelitscheff, born on September 8, 1898, in Moscow, Russia, was admitted to United States citizenship in the District Court of the United States at New York, New York, on December 6, 1943, and was issued Certificate of Naturalization No. 5581049. In his petition for naturalization the subject stated that his occupation was that of an artist painter; that he entered the United States for permanent residence at the port of New York, New York, ex SS Conte di Savoia on August 19, 1937 and that he was not married. At the time of his naturalization the subject was residing at 360 E. 55th Street, New York, New York.

In order that a search of the records can be conducted in an effort to locate a record relating to General Professor Golovin it is necessary that at least information as to his first name be furnished. Any additional information such as the subject's date and place of birth, the facts of his entry into the United States and the facts of his naturalization would also be of assistance in identifying a record relating to him.
