HOEPPWER, Hauptmann Dr.

German: III C Ast Munich early 1942: a solicitor at Pullach in civil life.

HOEPPNER, Sturmbannführer

German: born o. 1910: Leiter Abt III A RSHA Berlin'in June 1944: Leiter SD Leitabs Posen, and Geusatsleiter für Volkstumsfragen in March 1943: responsible for building up the SD organisation in the Warthegau: said to be a Razi extremist, unscrupulous and sadistic and to have been responsible for the murder and viotimisation of many Poles and Jews and for oppression of the Church: height 5'9" (175 cm): thin build, round face, sparse black hair, black eyes: strong Saxon accent.

HOERIG, Obergefreiter

German: with MEK 20 at Kavalla or Leros in June 1944.

HOERL, Oberleutnant d.R.

German: in command of the 15 (Paratroop)/4 Brandenburg Regiment: promoted to his rank as above while on leave in January 1944: reported to have been in Iugoslavia in 1943 and possibly to have returned with his company to Stendal.

HOERMANN, Oberleutnant Dr.

German: Verbindungsoffizier Abwehr I Luft O.B.S.
(Lialson Officer for the Abwehr, Air Intelligence section with C. in C., South) at Taormina, October 1942, but moved to Prascati with O.B.S. in November: controlled the day to day running of the Prascati station which provided O.B.S. with a constant supply of operational information from all quarters: fell sick in August 1943, and was sent to Germany, his work being taken over by RHOTERT: returned to Italy in November as Leiter Abanc (Padua) and Air Lisison officer with Luftflotte II, and controlled the special Luft Kommando Ho. 190: attended (Padus) and Air Lisison officer with Luftflotte II, and controlled the special Luft Kommando No. 190; attended an important conference of Abwehr officers at Plorence at the end of April 1944; made plans for dropping agents with W/T in Scuttern Italy at the end of May; reported in August 1944 to be preparing to drop a group of agents in Allied Italy or Northern Africa from a Liberator; very energetic and resourceful.

HOERNING, General der

German: BdO, Horway. Address: 4 Drammensvei, Oslo.

HOERSCHELMANN, Dolmetscher German: formerly in Dolmetschertrupp 3 in an Abwehr-Kommando on the Eastern Front: may have been transferred to Dolmetscherzug IX Danzig in February 1942.

HOERZER, Untersturmführer

in July 1943 to be an inspector of concentration camps: height 5'5" (165 cm): slim, dark hair. born c. 1898: Sipo & SD Trondheim:

HOESEL, Hauptmann Frans Gerhard O MAUR

German: born 26.5.93 (or 95): first reported in December 1942 when he replaced Hptm. KLEINSCHMIDT as Leiter III, and later as Leiter Demotika: in Pebruary 1943 attended an Abwehr conference in Sofia: on sick leave in April when KLEINSCHMIDT deputised for him: in June received the Bulgarian order Sweti Alexander V: replaced KLEINSCHMIDT as Leiter Mytilene in September 1943 and later as Leiter Meldetrupp 383 Mytilene-Chios: active in H and III work and in reporting on Allied activities in the Aegean area: medium height, fat, dark hair and eyes, yearnt expression. Address: Leipzig N. 21, Geibelstrasseborn 26.5.93 (or 95): first reported in December

HOESSELBARTH, Hauptsturm-Mhrer

German: reported in July 1942 to be a Sipo & SD official in Athens, under BLUME, and probably head of Amt VI, and was believed to be responsible for reporting on political questions and for organising espionage missions to the Middle Past; still in Athens in August 1944; height o. 5'10" (177 cm); fat, crocked face.

HOESTERMANN, Oberleutnant

German: possibly II B Abwehr Amt in August 1944: first reported in Berlin in August 1942: returned from a visit to Italy in November 1942: stated to be concerned with the personnel of KO Spain.

HOETTL, Stu-Sturmbennführer

German: born 19.3.15: Amt VI E RSHA in October 1943: appointed Ustuf. on 9.11.37: in SD in 1938: important member of the Italian Section, and head of Croatian Section of Amt VI RSHA: dealt particularly with the organisation of intelligence and sabotage networks in Italy and Croatia: travelled as special courier of the RPSS to Rome on a secret mission in August 1943 and again visited Rome and Zagreb in September 1943: report in December 1943 to have moved his headquarters to Vienna and to have installed himself in the office of the Vienna and to have installed himself in the office of the IdS, Theresianumgasse 17, Wien I: still in Berlin in January 1944: visited Prague in February 1944: SS No. 309,510: married: (private tel. Berlin 441255).

HOEVELMANN

German: arrived in Paris in the third week of May 1942 and went on to Le Havre: was reported to be in touch with I Wi Nest Cologne.
