Biographic Information

Dr. Frank L. Campbell

1. Dr. Campbell received a B.S. from Pennsylvenia in 1921, an M.S. from Rutgens in 1924 and a Sc.D. (entomology) from Harvard in 1926. During the period 1926-1927, he was an associate professor of Biology at New York University. In 1927, Dr. Campbell joined the U.S. Department of Agriculture, where he was an associate entomologist with the Bureau of Entomology until 1930 when he became an entomologist and later senior entomologist with the Bureau of Entonology and Plant Quarantine. In 1936, he became an associate professor of entomology at Chio State University and was appointed a professor in 194C, a position which he held until 1943 when he became Executive Assistant of the Research Foundation. From 1943 until 1948, he was editor of the "Science Fonthly," and in 1948 became the Assistant to the Administrator, Agricultural Rosearch Administration, Washington, D. C. Dr. Campbell held this position until 1 April 1948 when he joined CIA. In addition, Dr. Compbell was a consultant to the Chemicals Division, Office of Agricultural War Tolations, U.S. Dopartment of Agriculture, in 1942. He was a member of the editorial committee of the "Journal of Agricultural Research" from 1929 to 1936, and the publication committee of the "Journal of Economic Entomology" from 1937 to 1941.

2. Dr. Campbell belongs to numerous professional societies including the Entomological Society of America, the Chemical Society, Association of Economic Entomologistsk Entomological Society of Washington, the Unshington Academy, and is an honorary member of the Pest Control Association. Dr. Campbell has specialized in the relative toxicity of stomach poison insecticides to insects, toxicity of rotenone-bearing insecticides, methods for determining the effectiveness of household insecticides, chitin in insects, and synthetic organic insecticides.
