On 12 June 1958, at the Washington District Office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Old Post Office Building, Washington, D. C., Subject's Alien File No. A10 143 283 (Confidential) was reviewed and found to contain only a letter, dated 20 September 1957 from the Immigration and Naturalization Service to the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, stating as follows:

"Reference is made to your memorandum of 15 March 1957, requesting information from our files as to whether or not Subject ever visited the United States.

"A perusal of our file, A10 143 283, does not reveal any record of the Subject being admitted into the United States. A further check of our Non-immigrant indices in our Central Office failed to reveal any record of the Subject having been admitted to the United States."

The only information contained in Subject's file at the time of the above mentioned review, apparently, was a memorandum from the Federal Bureau of Investigation dated 15 May 1957 with an attached memorandum containing information from the files of the American Embassy at Tokyo, Japan dated 24 April 1957 indicating the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, United States Army Forces Far East, had information concerning Subject in memorandum dated 7 February 1957 classified confidential and prepared over the signature of Brigadier General P. H. DRAPER, Jr.

The file also contained a memorandum dated 25 February 1955 from the Federal Bureau of Investigation to the Director, Office of Security, Department of State, regarding Subject's entry to Australia in 1954 enroute to New Zealand.

The file contained no information that Subject has ever been granted a visa to enter the United States, although Subject claimed he had been granted a visa to the United States about 1950 but the "trip did not materialize."

The files of the Central Office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service were searched in a further attempt to determine whether Subject has ever entered the United States, and no record of such an entry could be found. Therefore, according to the records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Subject has never been admitted to the United States.

No additional information was available at this source.
