- 1. Yearf ARDUR, ex-member of the Mational Committee of Jerusalem, arrived in Cairo from Assess on 20 May 1953, bringing with him a message to the ex-Grand Mufti of Jerusalem, Hajj Amin al-RUSAYNI, from a minister of the new Jordanian Cabinet, Amear al-KHATIB. The message advised the ex-Bufti of the decision of the new Jordanian cabinet to ally themselves more closely to the other Arab countries in syposition to Great Britain, regardless of the dissertitish policy advocated by the real ruler of Jordan, GLUES Pasha, head of the Arab Legion.
- 2. During his meeting with AHDUH, the ex-Mufti stated that fritish policy toward Jordan had always been to keep Jordan on unfriendly terms with other Arab countries, especially Saudi Arabia, and to keep the Jordanian economy at such a low level that Jordan was forced to rely on Britishyfinancial aid. The Mufti added that there could be no cooperation between Jordan and the other Arab states until this situation was improved. Relations between Jordan and Saudi Arabia were improving but an Arab mation would have to replace Great Britain in givilina. Jordan financial aid before real Arab solidarity could be attained.
 - 1. Pield Comment. On 25 May, the Jordan parliament convened in a special session to protest Churchilles "anti-Arab" speechings urged the Government to support Egypt's "just case" against the British.
