DESCRIBE: None claimed and no record thereof. SUBJECT stated that he was too young to be drafted into the Soviet Army in 1941.

REMARKS: Investigation disclosed that he was a member of the "KOMSOMOL" (Young Communist League) while in the Soviet Union.

According to Belgian Police report received 6 Jan 55, SUBJECT is of good moral character. He associates with his compatriots only. He is not working at the present time and is receiving sickness insurance. He donates two hours a week to teach children Ukrainian. One of the references considers him an opportunist and a person who does not like to work.

SUBJECT stated that he has three uncles in the U.S.S.R. They are all teachers.

He speaks, reads and writes Ukrainian and Russian. He also speaks some German and French. His son, Alexander, is presently attending school at Liege, Belgium.

Par. 11 - ORGANIZATION MEMBERSHIP - cont'd:

"UNION OF UKRAINIANS IN BELGIUM" - He was secretary and editor of a monthly bulletin. (It is considered anti-communist). In 1948 he was a member of "Ukrainian Revolutionary Party" - It is a rightist-fascist organization. Until 1948 he was a member of "THEATRE KOTLAREVSKI" a Ukrainian Group (anti-communist) belonging to the "UNION OF UKRAINIANS IN BELGIUM" and "UKRAINIAN AID SOCIETY".

He also stated that he was a member of the "LEGION OF SIMON PETLURA" a rightist Ukrainian organization.
