- l. Wost Germans are potentially the most promising field for contacts. Of those listed in the Foreign Ministry's latest publication on the subject, the following are probably major targets:
- a. Gilding BEHOTUSON, DrA buseau, Florag. 19. This native of Sweden is a former dramatist at the LUNEOK city-state theater, a Social-Democrat in spirit if not in party membership, and a fellow who likes his confort. He is among the most intelligent of the dermans in town. But he says he never meets any Russians, whether those of TASS or of the embassy. He has not talked with Hya MOKERSOV for more than a year, and knows Dmitri YERSHOV only by sight.
- b. Karl MARTHERALL correspondent for papers in Lunich, Karlsruhe and Kraissa Breson. Helther of the girls in the press roca know anything about him. Her do I.
- c. (D) Robert RIMAUN lives in Uppsala and has few contacts outside academic circles. I have not seen him since his return from Vienna, scheduled for the beginning of this mosth.
- d. (Pastor)Harald BUCH, a German Lutheran minister, covers feature material for Stavestrunk, Baden-Baden, a radio station. I have never seen him at political gatherings and his collecgues seem to know little about him.
- e. Carole you Challest is a lady dragon whose constant journalistic company is from 211y WINFRIM, with whom she shares an apartment. The two appear to be old-school, pre-1914 Greesdeutsche, in poor health and, judging from their looks, in poor disposition.
- f. (Dr) Gunter DALLHAMH, correspondent for Sender Freies Borlin, has been ill for several years, but may have possibilities. I have not seen him cinco early 1955.
- g. Tormy WISLER, who works for Interreport Presse-Agentur, Vienna, is also an unknown at the press room.

  - j. <u>Ervin LORUE</u>, who recently turned 60, is a supplier of picture to Swiss and German picture weeklies. He is a funny man, able to pun in Swedish and German and occasionally in English, but has never admit to me any contacts to the East.
  - k. Kurt HEBBANN, Besler Machrichten correspondent, is a "hungry"

- (1) Alfred WANDAVIST is helf Iraqi, half Swede, but has lived in Sweden only a short time. He is a young man on the make, and may have potential.
- (2) (Miss) Lionita TURNIVA: RT. correspondent for Le Matin, Beirut, may be a Maltic rofugee or a Fleming. Robody knows much about her yet. She lives with a Fru Alma TRUMERT, possibly a relative.
- (3) Nabil Salama MOUSSA, who writes for kl-Sahara, Khartum. Know nothing about him. Sounds like an exchange student.
- (4) Reginald thirbor, correspondent for Dawn, Karachi. Probably a student also.
- 4. Of the Finns, the only one who seems potentially promising is Arro-Tilating, an ex-Commis who now corresponds for the Finnish Korkers' Press. He seems to have some contacts behind the iron curtain, but does not go there himself any more. It is my impression that he has not been found very informative or useful in the past.
