1. There is at present no known Communist activity in Bandung. The only agents known to be operating there are those of the Darul Islam from south Tasikmalaya and those of the Tjitarum Brigade from north Tjandjur.

15 September 49 and as noted

- Two Chinese Communists from China, TJUNG Triang Bao and TJHIN Siang Min, recently infiltrated into Batavia. They are reported to be specialists in organizing Communist military units. Both the Foreigners and Intelligence Service of the Police Department and the General Research Service of the Solicitor General's Office are looking for them.
- Mohamad Djoni, chairman of the Partai Komunis Indonesia Merah, is scheduled to hold a meeting in Prambanan, Jogjakarta, from 17 to 22 September 1949 for the purpose of coordinating about 90 Communist and extremist political groups.

Washington Comment: An ANSA dispatch of 1 September 1949 carried the following report from the agency:

A "guerilla Congress" will be held in Bandung for the purpose of coordinating all Indonesian fighting organizations, including the TWI, and formulating their future policies. It has been learned that in preliminary talks held by representatives of 30 fighting organizations at Prambanan, near Jogjakarta, recently the guerrillas vowed they would continue the fight for their fallen brothers to "the last breath" to defend the freedom of their country. It is expected that they do not expect the attack of the government troops. It is probable that they are holding the congress with a view to eventually disarming the conference. The congress will be held in Prambanan on 17 September 1949.
