The following is a list of KOLLENYI's probable contacts and acquaintances and biographic data on them for the period 1945 to 1955. The exact relationship, when specified in EOS files, is included with the name.

1. Jenoe AMBRUS apparently worked for the Americans through Kollenyi and for the French through Josef VEGH. In 1950 he was arrested in Hungary while on an exfiltration mission.

2. Nikolous ARNOLD met Subject circa 1954. He is probably identical to Dr. Nikolaus ARNOLD, born 1 May 1899 in Rumania, who in 1954 was a journalist and was associated in some way with Josef GINSBURG.

3. Fnu BATJAS worked for Subject in "Developmental Project 35" circa 1949.

4. Sandor BIRO was a person whom Subject tried to introduce to Emil SZALANCZY in 1948, possibly as an agent candidate.

5. Laszlo CZETENYI, Chief of the Hungarian Caritas Mission in 1951, conducted refugee debriefings, probably providing resultant information to KOLLENYI.

6. Jozsef CZIKELY, who resided in Liefering-Rott, was a member of Subject's group in 1952. He is probably identical to the Major or Colonel Fnu CZIKELY who conducted agent training for Subject in Salzburg circa 1950 and the Fnu CZIKELY (@ Dr. GUTTMAN, @ HOSSZU) who was a regular debriefer for Subject in 1950.

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7. Johann DANZINGER, born 28 June 1925 in Vienna, was possibly one of Subject's contacts in 1952 for information about Danube shipping.

8. Dr. Eugen (or Jenoe) DECLEVA was a close associate of Imre KLEIN. In 1950 DECLEVA reportedly peddled information to Josef VEGH, the Italians, the BND, and/or General ZAKO's organization.

9. Fnu DIETRICH, who was with the Hungarian Welfare Office in Salzburg in 1950, probably directed refugee sources to Subject.

10. Herbert DOHNAL (@MALLNER), born 24 February 1917 in Marburg, recruited KOLLENYI to work for Rupert MANDL.

11. General Ferenc von FARKAS zu KESBARNAK, formerly with the Hungarian Army, was trying in 1950 to assume leadership of the MHBK. He may be identical to the Ferenc FARKAZ (sic) who in 1950 worked at the MIS (formerly CIC) Screening Center in Salzburg after being placed there by Subject's recruiting team. He may also be identical to the Ferenc FARCAS, who by 1955 no longer worked for Subject and was the instigator of much conflict within Subject's group.

12. Friedrich FRANK, born 4 February 1909 in Pomerania, was the Dst. 2 case officer who turned Josef GINSBURG over to Subject.

13. Andrej GARZIK (@ Andreas EDER) worked at the MIS Screening Center in 1951 and gave refugee debriefing reports to Bertalan SZENDROEI (who passed some to KOLLENYI), to Fnu TAKACS (for Detachment 35 in Linz), and to Albin KAPITANFEY (for the French).

14. Captain Fnu GERENCSEK was in charge of the defensive intelligence section of Subject's group in Salzburg in 1950. He may be identical to Mihaly GERENCSEK, who was a Hungarian Nazi agent in Switzerland in 1944.

15. Lieutenant Erwin GEVAY was General ZAKO's adjutant in 1950.

16. Josef GINSBURG, born 24 March 1908 in Rumania, was the asset whom Friedrich FRANK turned over to Subject about 1954.

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17. Major Arpad GOSSY was an office worker for Subject's group in Salzburg in 1950.

18. LNU, Fnu was an interpreter for Emil SZALANCZY circa 1950.

19. Fnu HAMVAS, like Fnu DIETRICH, worked in the Hungarian Welfare Office in Salzburg in 1950 and probably directed refugee sources to Subject.

20. Istvan HEGEDUS (or HEGEDUES) was placed in the MIS Screening Center in Salzburg by KOLLENYI's recruiting team sometime before or during 1950. At that time, he was probably also associated with Hugo TRUX. By 1952 HEGEDUS, using the alias of BARSONY, worked as a "legman and fingerman" for Subject's group. By December 1953, however, he had broken with Subject and/or his group and reportedly tried to spread dissension within it for revenge.

21. Arpad HENNEI spotted refugees which he referred to Subject.

22. General Gusztav HENNYEY, a former Hungarian Army officer, was the Subject of at least one of KOLLENYI's reports in 1950.

23. Michael HOELLER (@ ADLER, @ Michael HANAGY HALLER) born 10 June 1920 in Hungary, was an agent whom Subject directed in 1954.

24. Laszlo HORI (or HORY), General ZAKO's secretary, was described in 1950 as an informant for Subject. Earlier an attache at the Hungarian Embassy in Belgrade, he became a journalist in the 1950's.

25. Imre HORVATH may have been one of Subject's refugee sources in 1954.

26. Geza JELENCIS, born 11 February 1929 in Hungary, occasionally visited the Caritas School in Salzburg in early 1950's in the company of Kalman BOESZE, a self-proclaimed CIC border crosser. JELENCIS, however, was recruited by the BND in January 1951 as a border crosser and a "flying observer." He was one of the agents whom KOLLENYI directed, but he had been dropped by 1954.

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27. Father JOSEF, with the West Dahnhof Mission in Vienna, was in contact with Subject about 1951, probably in connection with Father JOSEF's interest in Caritas Mission work.

28. Oliver KADAR was a refugee whom Subject debriefed in 1950. Subject later denied that he had debriefed KADAR and asked HUGO TRUX to forget that he had earlier admitted this to TRUX.

29. Ferenc KANTOR, born 20 September 1922 in Hungary, was one of the agents whom KOLLENYI controlled for the DND during the early 1950's.

30. Albin KAPITANNFY was the CE man for ZAKO's organization(s). In 1950 he gave MHBK information to Subject for the DND and allegedly also gave information to the French.

31. Dr. Karl Kurt KLEIN, who worked for Subject in Salzburg in 1950 and who was the brother-in-law of Colonel ZSOLNAY, may be identical to Dr. Imre KLEIN.

32. Miklos KOPONAY, born 25 September 1912 in Szombately, was a member of the KOPJAS Group and worked for CIC in 1947. About 1950, when he was in charge of the Press and Propaganda Section of the MHBK, he drew up the agreement between KOLLENYI and the MHBK whereby KOLLENYI paid a regular sum to receive MHBK intelligence reporting. In 1951, however, ZAKO dropped him from the MHBK.

33. Ferenc KOVACS (O TASHADI-KOVACS) ran his own network into Hungary in competition with Subject as early as 1948, when KOVACS was invited to merge with ZAKO.

34. Andre KOZMA, who was with VOA, knew Subject as early as 1951. In 1955 he was responsible for blowing Subject and his activities to AVH.

35. Baron Victor KRUCHINA, a British IS operative in the "CHIO" in Millstatt, was a source for information KOLLENYI and KOPONAY collected for the CIC until circa December 1947 when KRUCHINA severed his connections with them.

36. Bela LANCZY, a member of the P(R)ICHLER group, debriefed refugees in various cafes in Vienna in 1951. In 1952 he was described as a member of the GEOCZE (SZENDROEI ?) group of intelligence saboteurs in Austria. He alternately claimed to work for the French, British, DND and CIC.

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37. David LESZLI interrogated refugees in Vienna until 1951 when he migrated to Australia.

38. Aurel LISZAY (@ SZILASSY) received an invitation in 1949 from KOLLENYI to join him in Austria as an intelligence operative.

39. Emil LUDMANN replaced SZALANCZY in Subject's LINZ group.

40. Rupert MANDEL (HANDL) was chief of Dst. 2.

41. János MARKOVITS was a refugee whom Subject debriefed in 1950. Subject later denied that he had debriefed MARKOVITS and asked Hugo TRUX to forget that he had earlier admitted this debriefing to TRUX.

42. Lajos NADAS was a source for ZAKO's organization in 1950.

43. Geza NAGY monitored Hungarian police radio traffic for ZAKO and the British.

44. LNU, Fnu, a former Hungarian military attache in Poland, was an informant for Subject.

45. LNU, Fnu, a former member of the Hungarian Army, was in contact with both KOLLENYI and Emil SZALANCZY. KOLLENYI had helped him get a job in Salzburg in 1946.

46. Lajos NOVISZEDLAK, who resided in Zell in 1948, directed refugee sources to Subject.

47. Franz ORBAN, the IHBK representative in Switzerland in 1950, is probably identical with Franz URBAN.

48. Karl PILAS, born 31 August 1917 in Yugoslavia, was a ship's engineer in 1951 and may have been in contact with Subject.

49. Josef POLYAK, described in 1950 as a blackmarketeer and professional smuggler, was recruited by Sanior VISHNEY as a courier into Hungary. POLYAK participated in at least one exfiltration mission.

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50. Dr. Vassil RADOEV, a former medical officer in the Bulgarian Army, debriefed Bulgarian refugees in Graz for Imre KLEIN and/or the BND. About 1951 he apparently had a disagreement with KOLLENYI (degree of seriousness not specified).

51. Henrik RATKY, a close friend of DECLEVA, worked as an informant until he was dropped in June 1949 after a hostile recruitment pitch by the British IS.

52. Istvan SALTESZ was described in 1953 as probably working for Subject.

53. Josef SFAZAL, who lived in Vienna and who was an employee of a Danube shipping firm, was listed in 1952 among Subject's possible contacts.

54. Josef SCHMIDT, described in 1950 as a blackmarketeer and professional smuggler, was recruited as a courier into Hungary and participated in at least one exfiltration mission.

55. Fnu STADLER sold information to Bertalan SZENDROEI and Bela LANCZY in 1951.

56. Laszlo SUHEI, the chief storckeeper at the Caritas Mission in Salzburg, spotted new refugees for Subject's group and was a contact of Laszlo SZITA.

57. Emil SZALANCZY (@ HAUER), who at one time worked for the British, was handled by KOLLENYI for CIC in 1948. For some time, he was chief of KOLLENYI's Graz network, but later he moved to Salzburg.

58. Janos SZANTO, born 15 August 1928 in Szekesfehervar, was once a technical draftsman in Hungary, but resided in Salzburg in 1952.

59. Laszlo (or Ladislaus) SZEKELY (@ Josef FROEHLICH), born 18 December 1924 in Sopron, was a close friend whom KOLLENYI had met in war college.

60. Bertalan SZENDROEI (O GOECZE, @ Bartolomeus P(R)ICHLER) worked for CIC through Bela LANCZY and had sub-agents who reportedly traveled to Hungary.

61. Colonel Karoly SZITA, born 3 April 1897 in Andrashida, was an agent handler in Dst. 2 in 1950. Before the war, SZALANCZY had served under him in the G-2 Section of the Debrecen Army Corps in Hungary.

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62. Dr. Kornel TARCZALY, born 20 May 1921 in Budapest, was described as the MHBK representative in Switzerland in 1950.

63. Vince TEGLAS, a blackmarketeer and professional smuggler, was recruited by Sandor VISNYEY as a courier into Hungary. He participated in at least one exfiltration mission.

64. Ilona TORCH was a friend of Oliver KADAR and Janos MARKOVITS, who used her residence in 1950 to meet their contacts, etc.

65. Janos TOTH was a caretaker and debriefer at the Ledigenheim DP Camp in Vienna in 1951.

66. Jenoe TOTH, born 8 May 1927 in Fertocendred, was a truck mechanic who lived in Salzburg in 1952. In 1951 he had been one of Subject's refugee sources.

67. Hugo TRUX was a co-worker with KOLLENYI for CIC in 1949 and 1950.

68. Laszlo VIDRA was one of Subject's refugee sources in 1951.

69. Sandor VISNYEY, born 25 May 1917 in Hungary, was in contact with TRUX in 1950. He was in charge of offensive intelligence and agent training in Salzburg for Subject. He was reportedly kidnapped by the AVH and arrested in Hungary in December 1956.

70. Laszlo VURAY, born 6 June 1925 in Budapest, directed a radio intercept program in Austria but was terminated on 20 February 1954. Subsequently he went to work for CIC.

71. Andreas WEISZ, born 4 March 1929 in Szombathely, was dropped in December 1952.

72. Josef WESZELICS, a blackmarketeer and professional smuggler, was recruited by Sandor VISNYEY as a courier into Hungary. He participated in at least one exfiltration mission.

73. Jozsef ZIKELY, worked for Dst 2 until he was dropped on 28 February 1954.

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74. Mihaly ZSOLNAY worked in "Project 34," probably under Karoly SZITA. He may be identical to Colonel Fnu ZSOLNYAI, an MHBK member in 1950 who was the brother-in-law of Dr. Karl Kurt KLEIN.

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
