1940 Resigned SEITUKAI presidency. Established KUHARA Mining Co.; Repre KUHARA & Co.; President, KTOHO Life Ins Go. Elected to Lower House four times in Tamaguchi prefecture.

Advocated dissolution of political parties. After the assassination in Feb 1936 he and General MASAKAI were detained as suspected chief accomplices, but both were cleared of complicity, chiefly because of their influence and high position.

Army favorite. Has financed some of the GENYO SHA projects (Pacific Affairs, XVII,#3, p.27, September 1944).

Manchurian industrialist who would be familiar with Japanese expansionist circles particularly the Kwantung Army, Mentioned in folder as person to interrogate for political information. (WD Target Folder XVIII, May 1945).

Former president of the now defunct SEIYUKAI is planning to run for the Lower House. illighthanabent integration that the investigation of his possibility of being a war KUHARA mas recently informed

Former president of now defunct SEITUKAI, once the most powerful political party in Japan, became member of IOSHIDA's Liberal Party 3 Nov, KUHARA, who was purged after Japan's surrender as Japan's political leaders, reinstated 2% months ago when the Japanese Government was given authority by SCAP to conduct a mass depurge, His affiliations with the Liberal Party reportedly made at the request of Prmier IOSHIDA himself (FBIS, 5 Nov 1951; CENTRAL NEWS, Tokyo)

He also wields considerable influence with politicians of the Liberal Farty who are part of the UGAKI organization such as INUKAI Ken (and SHIDEHARA. 8 Sept 50

Reportedly has been in touch with certain Chinese Nationalists who have taken refuge in Japan **2008** or who are expected to come to Japan. 13 June 51

Chosen to head the political "aspects" of a new political party to be formed by IWAKURO Hideo, SHIBUSAWA Keizo, MIZUNO SHigeo, and others. Principal leader of the pre-war SZIYUKAI Party. Eighty years old. Close to FUKUYA Shunichi. 20 Sept 51

In compromise plan for re-organization of UGAKI JIS "federation" subject would have been on Board of Advisors.
