1. Reference is made to your communication of 29 December 1955 in which you requested a Covert Security Approval for the Subject's use overseas on a TDY assignment of approximately 120 days duration. It is understood that this assignment is for the purpose of activating Latvian-language broadcasts from Radio National in Madrid, Spain and that the Subject will be replaced as soon as feasible by another qualified individual.

2. In accordance with the provisions set forth in Clandestine Services Instruction No. 10-5 and Field Regulation 10-215, a covert security approval is granted for the use of the Subject, as described in your request as set forth in paragraph #1, above.

3. Subjects of covert security approvals are not to represent themselves as, nor are they to be represented as, employees of CIA.

4. Your attention is called to the fact that a covert security approval does not constitute complete compliance with the provisions of CIA Regulation 10-210. Therefore, if you should desire at a later date to change the status or use of this individual, a request for approval to cover any proposed change should be submitted to this office.

5. This approval becomes invalid in the event the Subject's services are not utilized within 60 days of the date of this memorandum.
