A. Brief

Project LCPROWL established an OPC subsidy to the Bund Deutscher Jugend (League of German Youth), a nation-wide, Western-oriented youth organization. This project has been implemented in four phases: (1) The utilization of the League during the October 15 elections in Eastern Germany; (2) Consolidating the League as a permanent nation-wide organization; (3) Employing the League in political warfare operations; (4) Guerrilla warfare and sabotage training of selected segments of the League's membership. Phase one was approved 9 August 1950 and the implementation of phase four, with no budget allotment, was approved August 29, 1950. Phases two and three, and an OPC budget allocation for phase four, were approved 21 December. Since OPC support began in June 1950, the League has developed rapidly from a loosely-knit group of individuals to a well-administered, growing, nation-wide organization of German Youth. Central offices have been established in Frankfurt and regional and sub-regional headquarters were organized. More than 2,250,000 pieces of propaganda material have been disseminated in East and West Germany. Training camps for activists have been established and preparation for guerrilla warfare and sabotage training under phase four is progressing rapidly.

B. Techniques Used

Efforts are in progress to cooperate and consolidate future League youth activities on a nation-wide basis with other Western oriented German youth organizations - with the League as the principal integrator

coordinating group. Emphasis is also placed on counteracting the efforts of the Soviet youth organizations, FDJ, which has requested additional aid from the German Communist party in order to cope with the League.

C. Cover

Funds are ostensibly from private and industrial anti-Communist donors and organization dues.

D. Operational Security

Contacts are maintained through the group's leader who receives and transmits OPC instructions and policy.

E. Operational Control

Control is based on ideological motivation, dependence on OPC's financial support and the leader's dependence on OPC staff for policy guidance.

F. Training

Training of activists engaged in psychological warfare has been very successful. It is contemplated that a training site and program will be completed in February - and that selected league members will commence training in guerrilla warfare and sabotage shortly thereafter, under direction of a covert OPC staff member.

G. Finances

Original allocation of \$ () OPC funds and \$ () KMIGNORE funds were approved for fiscal year ~~1951~~ 51 on 9 August 1950. In addition, DM () KMIGNORE funds for the implementation of phases two and three were approved for ^{the 15 months beginning 1/1/51} fiscal year ~~1951-52~~ 51 on 21 December 1950, and on the same date an allocation of DM ^{for remainder fiscal 1951} OPC funds were approved for the initial implementation of phase four.

H. Logistics Requirement

A training site and classroom facilities are being secured for the training of "Apparat" members in guerrilla warfare and sabotage.

I. Overall Objectives in the Area

1. To print and disseminate propaganda leaflets, posters, etc., furthering Western aims as specific occasions arise.
2. To expose Communist front organizations and Rightist groups that have cooperated with these organizations.
3. To take a firm stand against neutralism and to successfully arouse the apathetic youth of Germany into taking an active part in rebuilding a democratic Germany that will have a place in a United Europe.
4. To direct strong attacks against the FDJ and expose clandestine activities of this communist-sponsored youth organization.
