(fnn) LINHARDT/LINDHARDT; (fnn) PACHLER; (fnn) SEIDLER/ZEIDLER

1. In about July 1953 Major Vasily Mikhaylovich SICHNIKOV of the GRU legal residency in Vienna proposed to recruit three Austrians holding positions in the Austrian government, (fnn) LINHARDT/LINDHARDT, (fnn) PACHLER, and (fnn) SEIDLER/ZEIDLER. However, these persons had been recruited prior to that time by a Transborder Intelligence Point (RU). (Which recruiting element was not positively identified, but it was considered probable that LINHARDT, PACHLER, and SEIDLER were being run by a Transborder Intelligence Point located at the Central Kommandatura in Vienna, under Colonel Pavel Nikolayevich PAPPE, or possibly by the Vienna RU Intelligence Point headed by Colonel Mikhail Vasilyevich BEREZKIN.)

LINHARDT/LINDHARDT was described as working in the Austrian "Ministry of State Security" (probably the Ministry of the Interior), as was PACHLER. LINHARDT's position was not further described; PACHLER was referred to as a secretary. SEIDLER/ZEIDLER was then serving as one of the two personal secretaries to Adolf SCHAEFF (then Vice-Chancellor under Julius RAAB, now President of Austria).

COMMENT: Following are the results of preliminary Headquarters traces on FICHLER, suggested as possibly identical with PACHLER:

1. FICHLER, Dr. Joseph: Drs. Joseph Fichler and Dr. Peter Fichler are identical as Dr. Peter Fichler's address, as reflected in a FOLEY/2 report, dated 22 August 1950, is Vienna XVII, Gersthofstr. 24, and in the 1950 Vienna Telephone Book, Dr. Josef FICHLER Kinskr, is listed as residing at this address. FOLEY 2 files refer to a Peter Fichler who works in Graf's office, whereas other documents, such as the Antekalendar, refer to a Josef Fichler.

SCB 4575, dated 7 January 1955, to GCB, Vienna, states USFA, G-2, CIC, Det 35, have no traces on Dipl. Ingr. Joseph FICHLER.

Det 35 Report XDR-1641, 19 March 1952 - Report on Otto Schrab disappearance (former employee of 430th CIC Sub Det "C", Vienna). Dr. Josef Fichler is listed, among many others, as having known about Schrab. Fichler is contact to Ferdinand Graf, State Secretary-Ministry of Interior, contact of Albert L. Olson, employed by CIC and Alfred J. Bittner, former employee of CIC, later emigrated to Canada.

XOR 2635, dated 1 February 1952, states WOODBURY 230 check with Dr. Josef Pichler re Kriminal Inspektor Hartl's reliability. Pichler stated Hartl was 100 per cent anti-Communist.

MAVA 9763, dated 5 November 1951, re Stephan KIRIPOLSKY and Vojtech GERESNA. Stephan KIRIPOLSKY states a Josef Hofinger, Austrian citizen of Hungarian origin who was formerly employed with IRO in Vienna, but lost his job through "Guseh" ("Guseh" is cover name for an employee in Voice of America or Radio Free Europe who paid HOFINGER sums of money for occasional information). HOFINGER, at present, is trying to get employment with a censorship office in Vienna. KIRIPOLSKY stated HOFINGER is in close contact with Ministerialoberkammerer Dr. Josef FICHLER.

2. Traces from ☐ ☐ File on Peter FICHLER.

Report, dated 22 August 1950, Evaluation F-3: "State Secretary Graf and his closest associates". Source is ☐ ☐ whose main informant is Leopold HARTL, GRAF's representative in matters of police and gendarmerie. (Extract re Dr. Peter Fichler): "GRAF's legal consultant, particularly on Nazi questions, is Dr. Peter FICHLER. He is a personal friend and they associate extensively on a social basis. Both are from Carinthia and Mrs. FICHLER is a former secretary of GRAF's. Dr. FICHLER was born 13 April 1917 in Carinthia. He currently resides at Vienna XVIII, Gersthofstr. 24. He is the son of a medical doctor and is a member of a C.V. Fraternity (Cartel Verband). He has a steadfast open character, is smart, industrious, and ambitious. He is quite acceptable socially. He is devoted to his family and to his work, but still finds time for sports. FICHLER carries on political liaison in GRAF's name with Villach, Klagenfurt, and to a certain extent, with the other major cities in Austria. The police officials of the larger Austrian cities are all either friends or fraternity brothers of his. He has been connected with private Austrian negotiations with Tito."

MAVA 6671, 21 September 1950. ☐ ☐ Progress Report for August and September 1950: ☐ ☐ held a general conversation with Dr. Peter FICHLER, GRAF's legal consultant on some questions on 7 September 1950. On the evening of September 12, ☐ ☐ was scheduled to entertain FICHLER, HARTL, and their wives; report of this meeting has not yet been received.

instructions given to [] for transmission to []; further information is desired on Dr. Peter FICHLER. ([] Comment: FICHLER is coded in CIC source cards as Informant 1455, working for S/A Albert OLSON, Political and Economic Branch. His address is given as Vienna XVIII, Gerethoferstr. 24, which is a CIC confidential address also occupied by OKAPI 8. His present occupation is given as Secretary to State Secretary GRAB.)

3. Traces on Dr. Erich FICHLER

TS Document 37646, 14 December 1949, MAVA 4328, "7th Meeting with []", reports Paul Wilhelm MEININGER (Minister of the Austrian Legation in Budapest) and Erich FICHLER (2nd man in Austrian Legation, Budapest) were duped into issuing a passport to an agent of the Hungarian Intelligence Service (Rosa Schober) and transported her valuables from Budapest to Vienna, and later from Vienna to Bern via Austrian courier. Minister Gruber was enraged at both.

From TS Document 57139, 17 April 1951, MAVA 8124: GRUBER requested all Austrian Foreign Office posts in Satellite countries for troop movements and concentrations. Erich FICHLER, who has been with the Political Section, has been in charge of this incoming material. He prepares summaries for Gruber.

MAV 2697, 30 March 1951, Evaluation F-3: Dr. Erich FICHLER, Legation Secretary, Second Class, will probably be sent to Zagreb as Austrian Consul. He is now Legal Section (Abteilung 6 RA) of the Foreign Office, and is scheduled to spend six months as Gruber's secretary in the Minister's cabinet before being sent to Yugoslavia. Source Comment: FICHLER was drafted into the German Army at the outbreak of war. Shortly after his return to the Foreign Office in 1946, he was sent to Budapest. His father, Dipl. Ing. Karl FICHLER, is employed as a senior official in the Ministry of Social Welfare.

EAVA 1707, VIM 641, TS Document 57137, 12 January 1953: Dr. Erich FICHLER and Dr. WOLF, Secretaries to Foreign Minister GRUBER, stated GRUBER would oppose [] passing microphones to Finnett.

Erich FICHLER, JDR. Leg 3K1, listed in 1954 and 1955 Amtskalender as No. 2 Man in Minister to Germany's office located in Bonn.
