SECRETARY OF STATE HENRY KISSINGER CONFERRED AT LENGTH DURING THE NIGHT WITH SOVIET AMBASSADOR ANATOLY DOBRYNIN, FOLLOWING EGYPT'S DEMAND FOR U.S.-SOVIET FORCES TO POLICE THE MIDEAST CEASE-FIRE. THEY ENDED THEIR TALKS AT THE STATE DEPARTMENT SHORTLY AFTER MIDNIGHT, SOURCES SAID.

WITHIN TWO HOURS, FIRST WORD OF THE ALERT LEAKED OUT FROM SOME OF THE AFFECTED UNITS THEMSELVES.

ADMINISTRATION SOURCES SAID THAT DURING HIS CONFERENCES WITH DOBRYNIN, WHO HAD ACCOMPANIED KISSINGER TO MOSCOW LAST WEEKEND FOR TALKS THAT LED TO A MOSCOW-WASHINGTON CEASE-FIRE PLAN, THE SECRETARY OF STATE WARNED OF THE DANGERS OF SENDING RUSSIAN TROOPS TO THE WAR AREA.

THE UNITED STATES SAID QUICKLY AFTER EGYPTIAN PRESIDENT ANWAR SADAT SUGGESTED THE U.S.-SOVIET PEACEKEEPING FORCE THAT IT HAD NO INTENTION OF GOING ALONG. INFORMED SOURCES SAID KISSINGER TOLD DOBRYNIN "IT WOULD NOT BE A WISE MOVE" FOR RUSSIA TO DO SO EITHER.

AS OF 7:30 A.M. EDT, DEFENSE SOURCES SAID THERE HAD BEEN NO REPORTED MOVEMENTS OF SOVIET TROOPS TO THE WAR ZONE.

KISSINGER HAD A PREVIOUSLY ARRANGED APPOINTMENT AT THE WHITE HOUSE THIS MORNING TO GIVE CONGRESSIONAL LEADERS A RUNDOWN ON MIDEAST DEVELOPMENTS.

SADAT HAD ASKED FOR A UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL MEETING TO ASK THAT AMERICAN AND SOVIET TROOPS BE DISPATCHED TO THE AREA TO POLICE THE TRUCE, WHICH SADAT CLAIMED WAS BEING VIOLATED BY ISRAEL. SOVIET AMBASSADOR TO THE U.N. THREW DOWN THE SADAT REQUEST, AS DID THE WHITE HOUSE.

ALTHOUGH THERE ARE INDICATIONS SOME OIL PRODUCERS ALREADY ARE EASING AWAY FROM THEIR JOINT DECISION TO REDUCE EXPORTS TO THE REST OF THE WESTERN WORLD, THE BAN ON U.S. DELIVERIES WILL NOT BE LIFTED ONLY BECAUSE THE ARAB-ISRAELI FIGHTING ENDS.
