MEMORANDUM FOR THE DEPUTY SECRETARY OF DEFENSE

SUBJECT: Military Assistance Shipments to Pakistan

The attached tables constitute a restructuring of those included in your book for the 19 April SRG meeting on Pakistan and a refinement of content based on further research with the Services.

The posited delivery dates shown are for spare parts to be dispatched from Service depots and end items only. Components and spare parts to be shipped directly from commercial suppliers are not addressed since dispatch is reported after-the-fact via the submission of payment invoices. Queries to the contractors to determine status would tip our hand in the same manner as calls to the freight forwarder. The tables also omit coverage of miscellaneous spare parts requisitioned against open-ended sales cases (primarily Air Force). Those common items which do not require case-by-case scrutiny are processed by computer and would require a time-consuming machine records interrogation to trace. Though the Services are willing to undertake this task, I believe that the non-controversial nature of the material in question would minimize the return for the time and expense invested.

Only two shipments are currently being processed for delivery to freight forwarders: (1) one engine and transmission for the M-113 APC (for training purposes) held by the Army and (2) spare parts for exercise torpedoes (also training items) in Navy hands. In prospect for mid-May dispatch are \$46,000 worth of spare parts for live torpedoes (underscored on the attachment). All other increments are sixty days or more away.

The Services have been instructed to defer shipment of items in the pipeline pending receipt of your specific clearance on any end item, any spares package for lethal materiel useable in the civil war, and all ammunition.
