THE WASHINGTON POST

PETER OSNOS, FROM SAIGON, REPORTS THE NORTH VIETNAMESE OPENING A THIRD MAJOR FRONT IN THEIR COUNTRYWIDE OFFENSIVE TODAY WITH TANK, INFANTRY AND ARTILLERY ASSAULTS ON A SERIES OF BASE CAMPS, OUTPOSTS AND DISTRICT TOWNS IN KONTUM PROVINCE IN THE CENTRAL HIGHLANDS. (A-1)
