PURSUANT TO OUR TELEPHONE CONVERSATION, THIS DATE, THERE FOLLOWS THE RESULTS OF THE GALLUP TELEPHONE POLL:

1. 72 PERCENT OF THE PEOPLE IN THE NATION HEARD THE SPEECH. 39 PERCENT OF THE LISTENERS REPLIED AFFIRMATIVELY TO THE QUESTION, "DO YOU SUPPORT PRESIDENT NIXON'S PLANS FOR ENDING THE WAR?"

2. TO THE QUESTION, "IN GENERAL ARE YOU SATISFIED OR DISSATISFIED WITH THE PRESIDENT'S PROGRAM FOR TROOP WITHDRAWAL AS SET FORTH IN HIS SPEECH?", 77 PERCENT REPLIED SATISFIED, 13 PERCENT REPLIED DISSATISFIED, 13 PERCENT REPLIED NO OPINION.

3. TO THE QUESTION, "IN THE LIGHT OF THE PRESIDENT'S SPEECH, DO YOU THINK MORATORIUMS OR DEMONSTRATIONS ARE HELPFUL OR HARMFUL TO THE ATTAINMENT OF PEACE?", 12 PERCENT REPLIED THEY WERE HELPFUL, 72 PERCENT REPLIED THEY ARE HARMFUL AND 15 PERCENT HAD NO OPINION.

4. TO THE QUESTION, "DO YOU THINK THE PRESIDENT'S PROPOSALS WILL BRING ABOUT THE SETTLEMENT OF THE VIETNAM WAR?", 49 PERCENT REPLIED AFFIRMATIVELY, 25 PERCENT NEGATIVELY AND 26 PERCENT DID NOT KNOW.
