KISSINGER THE SITUATION ROOM SUBJECT: MORNING NEWS SUMMARY THE WASHINGTON POST LAURENCE STERN REPORTS THAT FORMER CIA DIRECTOR MCCONE SAID YESTERDAY THAT HE TRANSMITTED TO YOU AND RICHARD HELMS AN OFFER FROM ITT TO HELP FINANCE A U.S. GOVERNMENT EFFORT TO BLOCK THE ELECTION OF ALLENDE IN 1970. MURREY MARDER DISCUSSES THE LIBYAN FIGHTER ATTACK ON A U.S. RC-130 OVER THE MEDITERRANEAN YESTERDAY. HE STATES THAT SECRE-TÄRY ROGERS PERSONALLY CALLED IN LIBYA'S CHARGE D'AFFAIRES TO DEMAND AN INVESTIGATION AND AN ACCOUNTING OF THE INCIDENT. (A-1) ACCORDING TO DUSKO DODER, THE SOVIET UNION REVEALED YESTERDAY THAT IT HAD SUSPENDED THE DECREE REQUIRING HEAVY EXIT FEES FROM UNIVERSITY-EDUCATED SOVIET CITIZENS EMIGRATING TO NON-COMMUNIST COUNTRIES. THE SOVIET MOVE APPEARED TO BE TIMED TO SECURE U.S. CONGRESSIONAL PASSAGE OF A TRADE AGREEMENT GRANTING THE SOVIET UNION MOST-FAVORED-NATION TARIFF STATUS. (A**∞**1) MICHAEL GETTER STATES THAT ADMINISTRATION OFFICIALS SAID YES-TERDAY THAT THERE WAS STILL NO CONCLUSIVE EVIDENCE THAT HANDI WAS RESPONDING TO STRONG PRESIDENTIAL WARNINGS LAST WEEK TO HALT THE INFILTRATION OF MEN AND EQUIPMENT INTO SOUTH VIETNAM. WHAT IS HAS BEEN. (D-3)

JACK ANDERSON ASSERTS THAT THE COMMUNIST MILITARY BUILDUP THAT HAS RAISED PRESIDENT NIXON'S HACKLES, APPARENTLY WAS PRECIPI-TATED BY A U.S. BUILDUP LAST NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER. IT SIMPLY TOOK THE COMMUNISTS LONGER TO MOVE THEIR HARDWARE DOWN THE INFILTRATION ROUTES INTO SOUTH VIETNAM. THE NEW YORK TIMES BERNARD GWERTZMAN INDICATES THAT ADMINISTRATION OFFICIALS SAID THAT THEY EXPECTED SOVIET COMMUNIST PARTY LEADER BREZHNEV TO VISIT THE U.S. IN JUNE. THREE SPORADIC BATTLES WERE FOUGHT TODAY AGAINST MOSLEM SECESSIONIST REBELS AROUND THE PROVINCIAL CAPITAL IN CENTRAL MINDAND. (A=11) THE BALTIMORE SUN THE U.S. DELEGATE TO THE JMC DEMANDED TODAY THAT NORTH VIETNAM SUPPLY A LIST OF AMERICAN POWS HELD IN CAOS AND THE DATE AND PLACE AT WHICH THEY WILL BE RELEASED. (A-2) THE CZECHOSĽOVAK COMMUNIST PARTÝ LEADERSHÍP; APPARENTLY UNABLE TO RESOLVE DIFFERENCES BETWEEN THE MODERATE AND HARD-LINE CON-SERVATIVE FACTIONS, DECIDED TO RECOMMEND THE REELECTION OF PRESIDENT SVOBODA. (A=4) ARAB EMISSARIÉS SPED TO IRAQ AND KUWAIT YESTERDAY TO MEDIATE THE BURDER CONFLICT BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES. EGYPTIAN FOREIGN MINISTER ZAYYAT WAS ALSO SENT TO HELP CONCLUDE AN AGREEMENT.
