PENTAGON REVISES NUMBER OF MAYAGUEZ WOUNDED TO 40

THE PENTAGON MONDAY REVISED ITS ESTIMATE OF THE NUMBER OF MEN WOUNDED IN THE MAYAGUEZ RESCUE TO 49 AMTO CONTINUING CONFUSION OVER THE TOLL. THE NUMBER KILLED REMAINS AT FIVE. AND 16 WERE LISTED AS MISSING, IKE PAPPAS (CBS) SAID THE PENTAGON DUESN'T HOLD OUT MUCH HOPE THAT 13 OF THE 18 MISSING ANF ALIVE.

"CHARGES HAVE BEEN HADE THAT THE PENTAGON WAS TRYING TO MAKE THE OPERATION BETTER THAN IT WAS IN TERMS OF LOSSES. STATE DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN JOSEPH LAITIN GENTED THE CHARGES." THE PAPPAS (CBS) REPORTED.

LAITIN CONFINED THAT THE HODIES OF THOSE KILLES HAVE NOT BEEN RETURNED; AT LEST ONE MARINE WHO WAS KILLED WAS LEFT BEHIND ON TANG ISLAND UNDER HEAVY ENEMY GUNFIRE DURING THE NIGHTIME WITHDRAWALL IT WAS THE SECOND TIME THAT AMERICANS HAVE FAILED TO RETURN WITH THEIR DEAD." PAPPAS REPORTED.

MIN THE BACK OF EVERYBODY'S MIND AT ALL IF THESE MEETINGS THAT WERE HELD THAT WEEK WAS THE PUBBLO CASE, THE FACT THAT IF THESE MERCHANT SEAMEN WERE TAKEN TO THE MAINLAND OF CAMBODIA, THERE HOULD BE MONTHS AND MAYBE YEARS OF NEGOTIATION WHILE THEY LANGUISHED INPRISON. SECRETARY KISSINGER MET WITH SOVIET FOREIGN MINISTER ANDREI GROMYKO MONDAY FOR THE DAYS OF TALKS DESIGNED TO RESTORE THE MOMENTUM OF DETENTE, THE TWO MERE SCHEDULED TO DISCUSS THE FUROPEAN SECURITY CONFERENCE, THE SALT TALKS, AND THE MIDEAST, KISSINGER SAID, * I THINK METIL MAKE SOME PROGRESS HERE, " NBC/UPI REPORTED.

FOR MOST OF MONDAY, "KISSINGER WAS A VISIBLE STUDY IN NONCHALANCE," TED KOPPEL (ABC) SAID. "THE ANTMATED CHATTER

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THAT PRECEDED THIS AFTERNOON'S FIRST MEETING, MASKED AN OMINOUS UNDERCURRENT TO THESE TALKS.

"THIS IS THE FIRST EYE-LEVEL SOVIET-AMERICAN MEETING SINCE THE FALL OF CAMBODIA AND SOUTH VIETNAM, AND KISSINGER IS DETERMINED TO LEAVE NO DOUBT WHATSOEVER IN GROWYKO'S MIND ABOUT THE CONTINUING FORCEFULNESS OF AMERICAN INTENTIONS. THE OVERRIDING ATMOSPHERE OF CAUTION LEAVES LITTLE PROMISE OF SPECTACULAR DIPLOMACY," KOPPEL SAID.

"NEITHER SIDE IS EXPECTING A BREAKTHROUGH IN THE (SALT)
TALKS OR IN THE AGONIZINGLY SLOW PROCESS TOWARDS PEACE IN
THE MODLE EAST. BUT THESE TALKS ARE ESSENTIAL NEVERTHELESS,
TO RESTORE MOMENTUM TO THE SALT NEGOTIATIONS WHICH STALLED A
COUPLE OF WEEKS AGO IN GENEVA, AND TO THE MIDDLE EAST PEACE
TALKS, WHICH ARE NOW A NECESSITY LOUKING FOR A FORUM," KOPPEL SAID.

RICHARD VALERIANT (NBC) SAID THE NEGOTIATIONS ARE STALLED ON THE TECHNICALITIES INVOLVED IN COUNTING THE NUMBER OF MULTIPLE WARHEAD HISSILES ONCE THEY'RE DEPLOYED. "BUT THE AMERICAN SIDE IS CONFIDENT THE PROBLEM OF VERIFICATION AND OTHER TECHNICAL DIFFICULTIES WILL BE WORKED OUT IN TIME FOR A FORD—BREZHNEY SUMMIT THIS FALL."

VALERIANT SATO NOTHING CONCRETE IS EXPECTED TO RESULT FROM THE MEETINGS, AT LEAST NOT IMMEDIATELY. "BUT IN LIGHT OF THE RECENT SETBACKS TO AMERICAN FOREIGN POLICY AROUND THE WORLD, THE ATMOSPHERICS HERE WILL PROBABLY BE AS IMPORTANT AS THE SUBSTANCE," VALERIANI SAID.

MARVIN KALF (CRS) REPORTED KISSINGER FOUND SOME OF MIDDLE-AMERICA IN MIDDLE EUROPE, "A YANKEE TOURIST BELLOHING OUT HIS PRIDE AT THE MAY THE U.S. USED ITS POWER TO RECOVER THE MERCHANT SHIP, MAYAGUEZ," THERE WAS A SHOUT OF MITHREE CHEERS FOR THE U.S.A." AS KISSINGER ENTERED HIS CAR.



"SINCE THE HOUSE IS NOT EXPECTED TO FOLLOW UP, THE VOTE IS CONSIDERED MAINLY A GESTURE OF SUPPORT TO SECRETARY OF STATE KINSTNEER'S CYPRUS DIPLOMACY WHEN HE VISITS TÜRKEY LATER THIS WEEK," HOWARD K. SHITH CABOD SAID. CATHERINE MACKIN (NBC) SAID THE PURPOSE OF THE WHITE HOUSE IN ASKING FOR A VOTE NOW WAS TO STRENGTHEN THE HAND OF FORD AND KISSINGER IN THEIR MEETING LATER THIS MONTH WITH LEADERS OF GREECE AND TURKEY. THE SALT DEADLOCK (EDITORIAL, EXCERPTED FROM THE WALL ST. JOURNAL)

SECRETARY KISSINGER IS MEETING WITH SOVIET FORFIGN MINISTER GROMYKO IN VIENNA TO TRY, AMONG OTHER THINGS, TO RESOLVE THE DEADLOCK IN THE STRATEGIC ARMS NEGOTIATIONS INTENDED TO IMPLEMENT THE AGREEMENT-TO-AGREE ANNOUNCED WITH SUCH PANEARE AT VLADIVOSTOK, THE DEADLOCK IS ITSELF A SIGN OF THE PITFALLS IN THIS MANNER OF NEGOTIATING, AND THE RESOLUTION IS LIKELY TO HE WORSE.

IN A NUMBER OF WAYS THE SOVIETS ARE PRESSING EVERY
AMBIGUTTY IN SALTHI, BUT THE U.S. HAS OFFERED ITS PROTESTS
ONLY AT THE MOST ROUTINE LEVEL. SURELY THIS IS A WARNING
THAT THE TECHNICALITIES ARE IMPORTANT, ALL THE MORE SO
SINCE THE CONTEXT OF THE ACREEMENT IS THAT THE SOVIET
STRATEGIC DEVELOPMENTS ARE SOARING WHILE THE U.S. DEVELOPMENTS ARE DECLINING, AND SINCE AT ITS BEST THE VLADIVOSTOK
AGREEMENT GIVES THE SUVIETS A 3-1 ADVANTAGE IN MISSILE
THROW-WEIGHT, THE BEST SINGLE MEASURE OF DESTRUCTIVE POWER
AND POTENTIAL WARHEAD NUMBERS.

THE DANGER IS THAT THE NEGOTIATORS ARE MORKING UNDER A SELF-IMPOSED DEADLINE, WHICH IS BOUND TO WEIGH HORE HEAVTLY ON A DEMOCRATIC GOVERNMENT THAN A TOTALITARIAN ONE.
