SUBJECT: Actions on Cambodia

ARMY review completed.

The following is a report on actions taken or underway on Cambodia from October 6 through 12 midnight, October 12.

INSTRUCTIONS APPLYMilitary Operations:

--Ground. Enemy attacks against defensive positions and friendly units on patrol continued. Operation CHENLA forces repulsed several enemy attacks and continue to improve their positions.
