Attached is check list for various options. Assuming option 3 is rejected, Win and I prefer option 2 for following reasons:

1. It requires minimum changes from original schedule and avoids logistics horror.

2. Bruce in Naples on Thursday would only compete with funeral, not be compatible with it.

3. Nothing else in trip appears to clash too sharply with Nasser's death.

4. Except for three nights in Naples and skimpy day on Thursday (which some might consider appropriate) rest of schedule is sound.

If President opts for option three, we should see Naples schedule thru permitting advance people to adequately plan roll-up, returning home Wednesday afternoon.

CHECK LIST

1. Decide Fleet schedule:

- a. Cancel all firing exercises only.
- b. Cancel all firing exercises and fly-by.

Discussion. Option A would require less time reduction in morning schedule. This time saving (perhaps one hour) should be applied at start of morning thus honors should start at 10:00 a.m. rather than 9:00 a.m. Regular schedule would be picked up from 12:30 p.m. onward.

Option B - identical to option A but would provide more time. It should permit starting morning schedule at 10:30 a.m. in lieu of 10:00 a.m. as in option A and would also permit more time to discuss overall trip options.

Check list for Trip Options.

If you choose option 3.

- Message to State informing State to cancel all stops with appropriate message from President to each Head of State.
- Inform Chapin to prepare roll-up schedule for all advance parties in coordination with Aide, WHCA, etc.
- Zeigler - USIA promulgate appropriate press statement re cancellation of visit.
- Message to Mulchaby and Bruce.

If we choose option 1 (Bruce in Naples.

- Request Italian Government approval to remain Wednesday and Thursday nights in Naples and all day Thursday in Naples.
