Margaret Roberts THATCHER**UNITED KINGDOM***Prime Minister (since May 1979)*

Leader of the Conservative Party since 1975, Margaret Thatcher is the first woman ever to serve as prime minister of Britain or of any European country. She is a self-proclaimed crusader for free enterprise, free trade, and economic revival. She has frequently declared her support for a strong NATO, an independent British nuclear deterrent, and the need for balanced and verifiable arms control measures.

The daughter of a grocer and a seamstress, Thatcher won a scholarship to Somerville College, Oxford, and graduated with honors in chemistry in 1947. While there she was president of the University Conservative Association. After working for four years as a research chemist in an industrial firm, she began to study law, specializing in tax legislation and patents. A member of Parliament since 1959, Thatcher has held several important government and party positions, including those of Secretary of State for Education and Science (1970-74) and shadow deputy chancellor of the exchequer (1974-75).
