POLISH CENSUS REGARDED AS WAR-PREPARATION MEASURE

According to Polish press, census has evoked flood of rumors. Provided for registration of wealth, land, and livestock. Peasants thought government, in view of tense world situation, about to confiscate supplies. Decrees also contributing to war psychosis. Hospital personnel, trained nurses, experts in medical analysis, and laboratory personnel have been advised that registration is obligatory. Stream of Russian war materiel to Poland or via Poland to East Germany increases. Russian troops in Poland increased. Polish coast under Russian control. Conscription tempo increased.
