SUBJECT:	Request Traces on Ten Byelo-Russians

1. Attached is a list of seventeen names of Byelo-Russians whose names figure prominently in the Department of Justice (DOJ) investigation of Nazi war crimes. We have been asked by the DOJ_ to provide any information, derogatory or otherwise, on these seventeen individuals.

2. This office has noted that seven of the names of the attached list (marked with a red X) have been traced before and need not be traced again, at least at the present time.

3. It is requested that the remaining ten names be traced on a priority basis. When IMS/OG/EIRS has collected the documents on these individuals, please advise the undersigned who will review them to determine whether or not a formal memorandum need be written on each name.

4. <u>The undersigned would appreciate being advised as soon as</u> possible of those names on whom there are no traces.
