the U.S.A. He had been a member of the Comintern one of the first 15 agents in Germany

especially valuable before his take-up as a [] source in Germany, reporting
on the then most secret BSV and KGB. LARSEN circulated in German police and

began to play down its value and finally pressured the Police into recalling
LARSEN to break for interrogation. Only later did it come out, according

had a preferred candidate [] that [] After interrogation LARSEN was
given a long jail sentence in Warsaw (there was no public trial), but was
released in 1950 as a result of the October revolution. The Soviets then
suggested that LARSEN be sent back to Germany to resume his agent-functions.
The US terminated its contract of activity with LARSEN and he expressed will-
ingness to return to Germany but on an account for the Soviets. After a
year or so further stay in Poland during which he recovered from the long
incarceration, LARSEN did return to Germany (presumably 1951) and was to try
now for a while and gradually acclimatize himself again to the German scene.
