1. Attached are three ZIPPER memoranda concerning the NAUMANN case. These add little to the information reported in MGLA-6408. In fact the principal interest they hold probably is an example of how guarded ZIPPER is in discussing this case with us.

2. Attachment # 1 describes the legalization of Dr. NAUMANN in Western Germany in 1949 beginning with his capture by the Soviets at the end of World War II, his "escape after four weeks without having been identified", living in the Soviet Zone until the summer of 1946 when he fled to the West where he lived black until he was legalized in the French Zone in 1949.

3. Attachment # 2 is a short summary of the political opinions of Dr. NAUMANN.

4. Attachment # 3 is a general description of ZIPPER's connections to Dr. NAUMANN. In giving us this report MERKER stated that they did not include the names of their two contacts to NAUMANN because we already knew they were OHEIMB and JACOBI. Admitting the possibility of some kind of connection between this case and UJ DROLLERIES 7 and 8. ZIPPER states, however, that they have no specific knowledge of any such connections. They were only slightly less reluctant to admit the possibility of its connection with SKORZENY in Spain. In other words, we may read into it any ramifications which we might wish. Obviously ZIPPER prefers to avoid any further discussion of this case with us.
